



# Snapshot of BIL Funding in NM (so far)

- \$3.6 billion of BIL funding for New Mexico programs and projects as of September 2023, including:
  - \$1.4 billion for transportation
  - \$698 million for water
  - \$675 million for broadband
  - Other awards for pollution cleanup, clean energy and other projects
- Increased federal investments in local capacity building and technical assistance
  - Ex: Creation of the South-Central Environmental Justice Resource Center at NMSU (\$10 million)
  - Ex: Increased funding for Southwest Environmental Finance Center at UNM (\$4 million)
- Prioritization of BIL funding to advance equity and justice and invest in historically disadvantaged communities



## USDOT Thriving Communities Program

#### Direct Technical Assistance for Communities

- 64 communities in the U.S. selected in FFY 2022, including Albuquerque
- Letters of Interest for next cycle due November 15
- Selected communities receive:
  - Two years of deep-dive assistance to plan and develop pipeline of transportation, housing and community revitalization activities
  - Three years of peer learning opportunities


#### Regional Pilot Program for States, Tribes and Regional Planning Orgs

- Recipients will provide support to communities
- USDOT will fund at least four pilots at \$1M each
- •NM DFA is preparing application for regional Thriving Communities assistance program in Northwest NM to involve local partners and invest in local transportation priorities

## Transformative Funding Spotlight

Decarbonizing the Transportation Sector

- Second largest source of greenhouse gas emissions in NM
- Public health impacts from air pollutants
- Global technology innovation and manufacturing transition to more electric vehicle options
- BIL funding for EV charging infrastructure
- October 2023 E.O. to convert state fleet to EVs by 2035
- More to come, including tax incentives for new/used EVs and home charging
