
Setting the Values

Scoping the Participation



The Western Transmission Consortium

Independent Transmission Companies

- Greater risk appetite
- Risk-adjusted equity position
- More initial capital to curate projects and spur projects

Investor-owned utilities

- Capital investment appetite
- Policy goals and increased demand driving interjurisdictional transmission needs
- Capital investment dependent on regulatory approval

Public Power

- Freedom to be pure off-take or to invest in transmission
- Cost allocation tied to members' benefiting
- Demand growth and economic development drives transmission needs
- Lower up-front capital investment but need to have "load in the room"

TWTC Progress to-Date



2023

- Consultative meetings with utilities and regulators starting in mid-2023
- Phoenix meeting attended by companies in March 2024
- ITC meeting and agreement on project allocation
- Stage Gate approach to participation and investment in Consortium
- Subscription Agreements and LLC Documents finalized December 2024
- Southwest Pod Project Curation Kick-Off March 2025
- Northwest Pod Project Curation Kick-Off June 2025




Upcoming Fall of 2025:

Progress: Southwest Pod

- Southwest Pod consists of eight projects across 2,000+ miles in Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah
- These projects are the result of TWTC analyses with participant feedback to scope and path
- TWTC members will form project companies and complete accelerated diligence into the feasibility, regulatory approvals and actual construction of projects will go forward






Progress: Northwest Pod

- Kick-off meeting in June of 2025 at the Western Power Pool
- One-one meetings with members to discuss load growth, resource adequacy needs, renewable mandates, and potential transmission solutions.
- Circulated initial set of curated projects and currently gathering feedback from members
- Extensive membership participation along with the Northwest's unique dynamics create layers of complexity
