Booming Borderland

- From 2023 to 2024 Santa Teresa's POE Total Trade Value grew from \$28B to \$40B a 43% increase.
- From 2023 to 2024 Columbus' POE TTV grew from \$313M to \$395M a 26% increase.
- Santa Teresa's explosive growth as one of the fastest-growing
 U.S. ports makes it a vital trade hub for the border.

Infrastructure at a Crossroads

- Our current infrastructure can't keep pace with this growth, demanding crucial upgrades to unlock our full potential.
- Investing in modern infrastructure means more freight, more jobs, and cementing NM Borderplex's role as a global trade leader.
- Without strategic investment, NM is losing opportunities to other states, who are aggressively investing.

Luna & Hidalgo Counties

- Columbus Facultative Wastewater Pond: Construction 90%
- Columbus Flood Control Project: Phase 1 construction 10%, Phase 2 design complete, Phase 3 contractor selected construction to start summer 2025.
- Columbus Water Storage Tank (Construction Phase): New project approved in the 2025 legislative session, 250,000 gallons.
