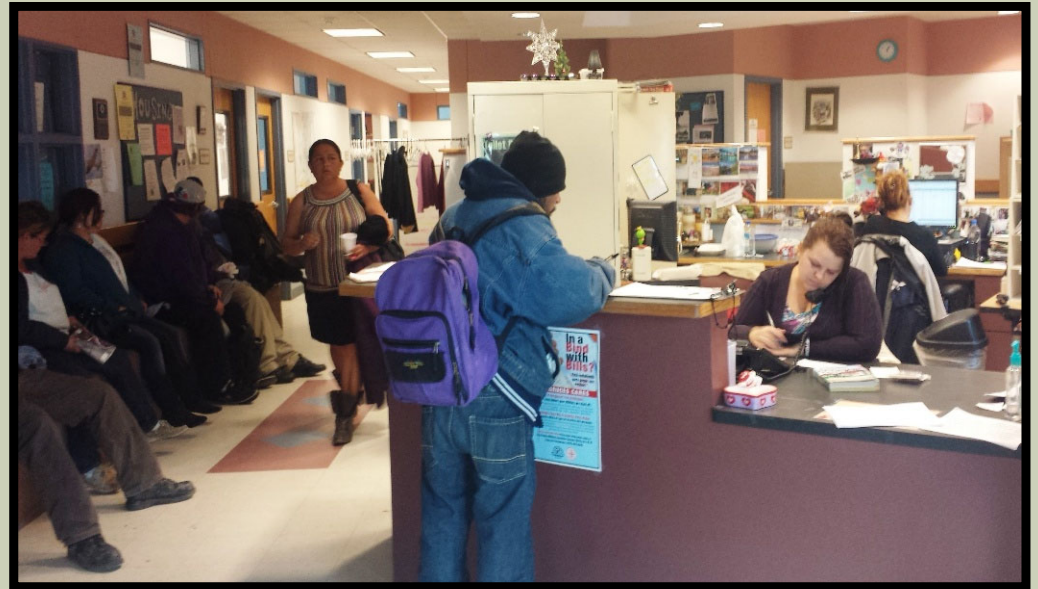

COMMUNITY OF HOPE SCOPE

- MVCH serves people experiencing homelessness and near-homelessness with a variety of services:
- Last year we served 10,894 people
- Laundry
- Showers
- Case management
- Behavioral Health Services



COMMUNITY OF HOPE

- Temporary shelter (Camp Hope)
- Housing assistance: Still compiling but close to 2000
- Income assistance: SOAR (Social Security Disability);
- Mano y Mano day labor program
- Outreach

VETERAN-SPECIFIC SERVICES

- Last FY, MVCH served 582 Veterans
- Housing; single site or occupancy at Veterans' Apartment complex; collaboration between MVCH and the MV Public Housing Authority (NM DVS grants)
- Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF): To provide supportive services and referrals for Veterans experiencing homelessness and near-homelessness.
- Intervention Supportive Services for Veterans: MVCH has an onsite Licensed Mental Health Therapist that meets with homeless and newly housed Veterans.



CHALLENGES

- Lack of affordable units ready for occupancy in our community, but this is changing!
- Unknowns on housing policies and practices at the federal level—Housing First, HUD-VASH
- NM DVS funding helps unhoused Veterans at Camp Hope and transitioning out of homelessness
