What are Restorative Practices?

Restorative Practices:

A philosophy, not a curriculum or program, that focuses on building positive relationships and providing opportunities for community members to take responsibility for their behavior and their lives.

At the heart of restorative practices is the belief that we are all in this together and that we are part of a supportive community. Identifies motivation and impact of action

Teaches alternative behaviors

Repairs damage done

Builds empathy


