

OBSERVATION AND ASSESSMENT (O&A)

- Combines overnight sobering for those requesting it, and individuals seeking assessment for needed services – potentially detox, Crisis stabilization, referral to other services/agencies. Vitals are checked, nursing assessment conducted if needed.
- Certified Peer Support Workers/Case Managers are available to provide information and support, referrals if needed/requested.
- Individuals may wait in O&A if units are full, until a bed is available – helps to manage patient flow, primarily in to detox.
- Clients no longer told when Detox is full, to leave to and then return for an available bed – eliminates a gap in care.
- Capacity: 60
- Duration: 23 hours and 59 minutes

LIVING ROOM PROGRAM (LRP)

- Drop- in program center staffed by Certified Peer Support Workers (CPSW).
- Individuals who do not meet criteria for other programs are directed to the Living Room Program.
- Certified Peer Support Workers offer case management services.
- Clinical staff available if needed.
- Transport to appropriate service can be provided.
- Clients may return if they need further assistance.
- Charging station for electronics and computer use is available.
- Food, water, and Coffee are available.
- Pet Friendly.
- Hours: Monday thru Friday 7am – 7pm

DETOX PROGRAM

- 10-day social model program includes medical management of withdrawal, Case Management, group activities.
- MAT induction.
- Warm hand-off to programs client requests – SAC, inpatient rehab, Intensive Outpatient Programs, Medication Assisted Treatment programs.
- Capacity: 30 (20 males / 10 females)
- Duration: Up to 10 days.

CRISIS STABILIZATION UNIT (CSU)

- Individuals referred by a provider, agencies, Mobile Crisis Units, etc., who have a mental health diagnosis.
- Those testing positive for substances can be diverted to Detox, then transferred to the CSU.
- Intensive Case Management to assist with multiple needs and to work toward longer term placements if needed.
- Short-term counseling, various activity therapies, groups.
- Capacity: 16
- Duration: Up to 14 days

SUPPORTIVE AFTERCARE COMMUNITY (SAC)

- Clients who have completed an inpatient rehab or detox, and express interest in working toward recovery.
- Must complete an application and interview to determine program eligibility.
- Work through a phased program featuring an evidence-based curriculum as part of the program.
- May stay up to 6 months; goals may be accomplished in a shorter time frame.
- Clients may come from Detox or Crisis Unit or may return to those units if they experience an increase in symptoms/relapse.
- Referrals are accepted from a variety of community programs, agencies, to include individuals released from MDC.
- Capacity: 30
- Duration: Up to 6 months

OUTPATIENT CLINIC (OPC)

- Psychiatric assessment and treatment of mental health and addiction.
- Ability to prescribe and manage psychiatric medications and medications to treat addiction.
- Clients may enroll upon discharge from any other Campus program, from any community referral sources, after discharge from MDC, from the surrounding neighborhood.
- Peer Support services available
- Contracted service to Duke City Recovery Tool Box.
- Hours: Monday, Wednesday and Friday 8am – 5pm

MEDICAL OBSERVATION AND TREATMENT UNIT (MOTU)

- Medically managed treatment and observation services, including MAT Induction.
- Contracted service to the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center (UNMHSC).

LAW ENFORCEMENT ASSISTED DIVERSION PROGRAM (LEAD)

- Community-based diversion program staffed by Community Case Managers.
- Goals include improving public safety and reducing unnecessary justice system involvement.
- Capacity: 12-15 Caseload per Community Case Manager
- Duration: Unlimited access to Community Case Manager following initial referral.

MARIPOSA PROGRAM

- Pregnant or post-partum women in need of housing and treatment services for substance use disorder (SUD).
- Must complete an application and interview to determine program eligibility.
- Work through a phased program featuring an evidence-based curriculum as part of the program.
- May stay up to 6 months; goals may be accomplished in a shorter time frame.
- Referrals are provided directly through the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center (UNMH)
- Capacity: 8
- Duration: Up to 6 months

MOBILE CRISIS TEAMS (MCT)

- Community-based crisis-response program staffed by a Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) trained law enforcement officer and a licensed clinician.
- Teams respond to 911 calls through a team approach to assist with nonviolent behavioral health crisis situations.
- Hours: 7 Days a Week thru 10pm

YOUNG ADULT PROGRAM (YAP) (OPENING JANUARY 2024)

- 30-day residential treatment program for ages 18-24.
- Comprehensive treatment for those suffering from substance misuse/addiction
- Building skills for recovery, re-entry to school/work, etc.
- Strong emphasis on experiential activities, interventions.
- Clients may come from Campus Detox or other detox programs, Young Adult Court, and any other young adult serving agencies.
- Intensive Case Management to develop “next steps” in recovery.
- Will have access to Outpatient Clinic or Crisis Stabilization Unit for any psychiatric needs.
- Capacity: 15
- Duration: 30 days
