

- Soilutions diverts organic waste (food waste, yard waste) from landfill and instead transforms it into compost, soil and mulch to replenish our state's depleted soils.
- Founded in ABQ in 1996; acquired by local business leaders in 2021,
   Soilutions has since tripled in size and is projected to double again by 2026.
- Operating on 14-acres in ABQ's South Valley, Soilutions is at scale and wellpositioned to partner with NM for organics diversion programs



#### How Compost is Made in 5 Pictures











Making Soilutions Compost starts by combining food waste (nitrogen) and yard waste (carbon) at ideal ratios to facilitate aerobic decomposition.

Managed in windrows until mature, then screened to ½"

Completed compost is ready to feed NM's soils

Compost helps our community grow food for their families!



### Partnering with corporations to divert more food waste

The EPA estimates that food waste is responsible for 58% of fugitive methane emissions from municipal solid waste landfills.

In 2024, Soilutions secured partnerships to divert food waste from statewide locations of:

- Whole Foods
- WALMART®
- Costco
- Sam's Club
- More partnerships in the works



In 2025, Soilutions will divert ~25,000 tons (50,000,000 lbs) of food waste from landfills and turn it into compost.



## Our Challenge: Increase yard waste intake to balance food waste



Soilutions needs to bring in 13,000 tons of yard/landscaping waste in 2025, with this need increasing each year as the company continues to grow.

Several initiatives in the works toward this endeavor:

- Partnership with Village of Los Ranchos (launching August 2024)
- US Forest Service Wood Products Innovation Grant
- Working to develop partnership with Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District administrators




#### NM Lawmakers should pass a ban on yard debris going into the landfill.

- Yard debris bans already exist in 21 states
- A ban on yard debris in the landfill will:
  - Drive private industry to recycle organic waste
  - Help divert more food waste and yard waste from the landfill to be turned into compost

- <u>Yard debris bans</u>: Arkansas, Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, West Virginia, Wisconsin
- Yard debris bans with exemptions for landfills with gas collection systems: Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Nebraska
- Food scrap collection mandates or aggressive legislation for keeping out of landfills:
  California, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Oregon, Vermont, Washington
- State Organics Diversion Requirements: The State of California, rather than banning organics from landfills, instead requires municipalities to create organics plans, as of January 2022.
