## Why History Day Works

- 2015 NM PARCC- 27% of Freshman Test proficient in reading
- TAKS (Texas) proficiency results: NHD 66% Non-NHD 19%
- NHD students outperform non-NHD peers on standardized tests in reading, science, math, and social studies
