Master Cooperative Funding Agreement



Master Cooperative Funding Agreement (MCFA)

- The Department of Military Affairs provides logistical and administrative support to approximately 4,000 soldiers and airmen.
- In order to support the National Guard's programs, the National Guard Bureau (NGB) and the Adjutant General (TAG) of New Mexico have entered into Master Cooperative Agreement(s) that establish the terms and conditions applicable to the contribution of NGB funds for the operations and training of the New Mexico National Army and Air National Guard.
- Currently, the Department of Military Affairs has two MCAs. One with ten (10) appendices and the other which is specific to the NMNG Youth ChalleNGe Academy. In FY20 we are requesting additional funding to add Appendix 11.

 Appendix 11 – Army National Guard Emergency Management Program Coordinator (EMPC) Includes 1 FTE. The Funding Source is 30% General Fund and 70% Federal.





NM National Guard Youth ChalleNGe



The Department of Military Affairs operates two residential classes each fiscal year with a graduation target of 225 cadets per year. The program is a 17 ½ month military-based training program consisting of a 22-week Residential Phase and a one-year Post-Residential Phase. The program is located in Roswell, New Mexico. The Funding source is 75% federal and 25% General fund.




NM National Guard Youth ChalleNGe



The New Mexico National Guard has completed 34 Cycles of the Youth ChalleNGe Program which began in July 2001. To date 2,654 New Mexico youth have graduated from the Program. Cycle 35 is scheduled to graduate on December 15, 2018.
