- 9-Month Wait to see a specialist

Programmatic Request:

- \$1.3M- Team-Based care serving all New Mexican's that have a movement disorder

Capital Request:

- \$3.5M- UNM HSC Matching Funds to 2019 State Severance Tax Bond Request

Behavioral Health and Substance Use Disorder



Overview:

- Highest alcohol-related mortality rate in the U.S.
- Opioid-related overdose deaths: In 2016, there were 349 opioid-related overdose deaths in NM, a rate of 17.5 deaths per 100,000 persons

Program Highlights:

- Increased Patient Access Through a New Integrated Behavioral Health Center of Excellence at UNM HSC Rio Rancho Campus
- Tele-Behavioral Health Program:
 - Opioid Intervention ECHO
 - Crisis Intervention Team ECHO

Programmatic Request:

- \$1.7M

Child Well-Being



Overview:

NM Ranks near the bottom in overall Child well-being. This includes:

- Children in Poverty – 49th
- Education – 50th
- Health – 48th
- Family and Community – 49th

Program Highlights:

- Expansion of the Child Abuse Response Team (CART)
- Expansion of the Averting Disparities in Outcomes by Building Engagement (ADOBE) program to Sandoval & Valencia Counties
- Develop a Child Well-Being ECHO

Programmatic Request:

- \$1.8M

Healthy Aging



Overview:

- NM will have the fourth most-aged population by 2030, rising from 39th
- The number of seniors in NM rises by 225% between 2011-2030. This equates to approximately 300,000 people

Program Highlights:

- UNM Center for Successful Aging will:
 - Maximize ones ability to, “Age in Place.”
 - Leverage and educate on geriatric care best practices
 - Expand clinical care
 - Healthy Aging Project ECHO

Programmatic Request:
\$1.8M

340B Drug Purchasing Program

- January 1, 2018- the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) implemented a new rule that significantly reduces reimbursement to hospitals and most cancer centers that participate in this program
- \$10M negative impact to the UNM Comprehensive Cancer Center while continuing to serve low-income, rural, and underserved patients
- Through personnel reductions, position freezes and restructuring, the Cancer Center was able to save \$4.2M
- Requesting \$5.8M from the legislature to cover the difference
