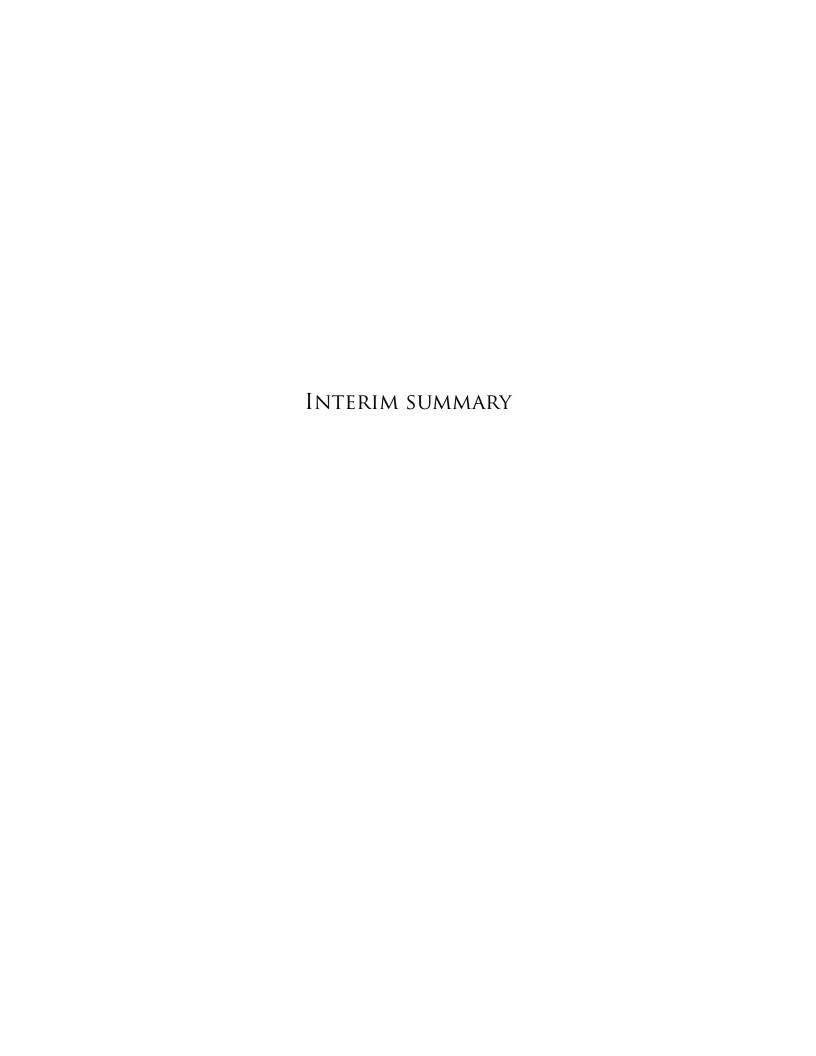

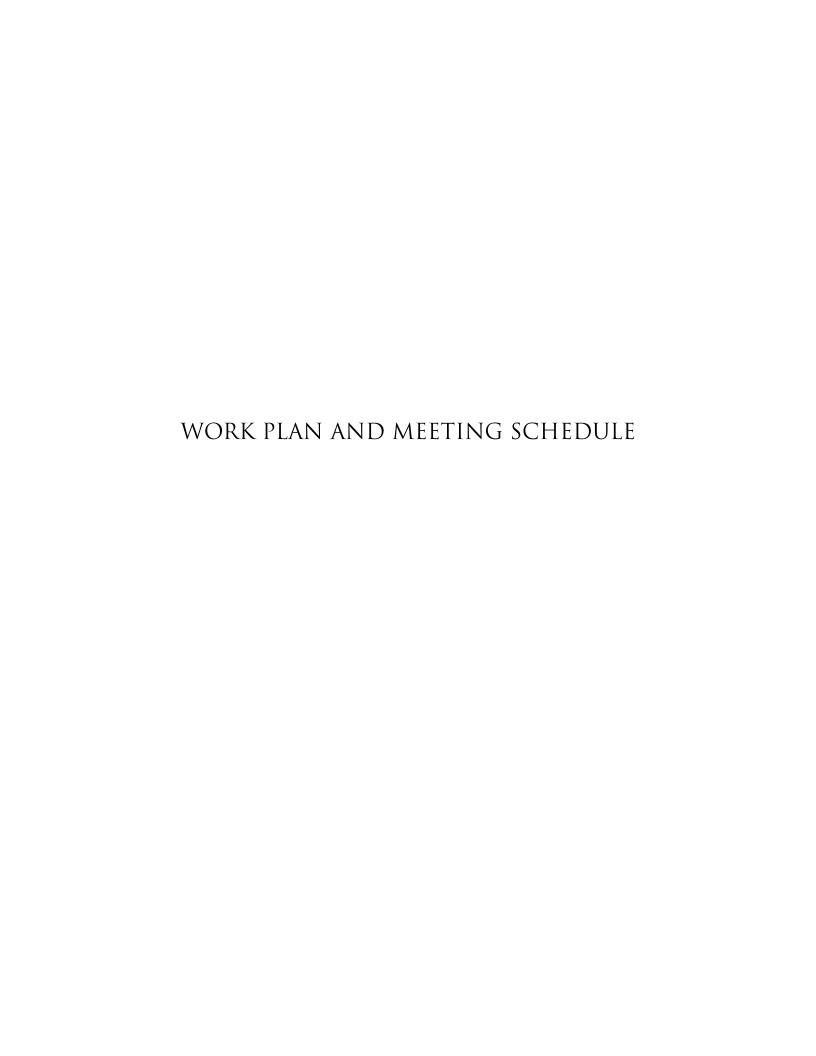
Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee 2025 Interim Summary

The Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee met five times in the 2025 interim across New Mexico to examine the state's transportation infrastructure needs, funding gaps and future initiatives. The meetings were structured to gather diverse perspectives from state, local, federal and international officials, as well as private sector representatives.

Throughout the interim, a central focus of the subcommittee was on transportation infrastructure funding. Subcommittee discussions addressed the State Road Fund, Federal Highway Administration funding and the Department of Transportation's (DOT) project priorities, funding gaps and proposed legislation for the upcoming 2026 session. The subcommittee also received an analysis of national transportation revenue trends from the Tax Foundation at the November meeting in Los Alamos.

Discussions at the July meeting in Santa Teresa centered on border and international infrastructure. Presentations addressed the Santa Teresa Port of Entry, the Border Highway Connector project and the border industrial complex. This meeting also included presentations from officials from Ciudad Juárez and the State of Chihuahua, Mexico, highlighting a multinational approach to logistics and development.

The August, October and November meetings in Deming, Silver City, Ruidoso and Los Alamos featured updates from local officials and DOT district engineers on specific regional projects, local safety concerns and maintenance priorities, in addition to updates by the DOT's division directors on the department's modal programs, including aviation, transit, rail and transportation regulation. Lastly, the subcommittee spent substantial time during the interim reviewing safety and technology initiatives, including the DOT's "Target Zero Initiative", bridge conditions, the problem of uninsured motorists and future technologies like autonomous vehicles, artificial intelligence-driven safety platforms and intelligent transportation systems.

Work Plan

The New Mexico Legislative Council created the Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee on April 28, 2025 to develop recommendations to meet the needs of New Mexico's businesses and residents for transportation and infrastructure and to identify current and new sources of revenue.

During the 2025 interim and as time permits, the Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee will review and discuss topics related to transportation infrastructure, including:

A. revenue:

- 1. current revenue sources and forecast, including the gasoline tax, special fuel excise tax, weight distance tax, vehicle registration fees and motor vehicle excise tax;
 - 2. alternative revenue sources; and
- 3. an update on federal funding, including funding provided by the federal Inflation Reduction Act of 2022, the federal CHIPS Act of 2022, the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, also known as the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, and the National Infrastructure Bank Act of 2023;
- B. the Department of Transportation, including an overview of and updates on the divisions, budgets, projects, funding, funding-related legislation from the 2025 legislative session, revenue forecast and transportation district engineer reports;

- C. costs rising costs and ways to decrease costs of construction and maintenance;
- D. the future of transportation:
 - 1. autonomous vehicles;
 - 2. electric vehicles and the electric-vehicle charging grid;
 - 3. drones;
 - 4. commercial space; and
 - 5. roadable aircraft;
- E. intelligent roadways;
- F. transportation safety;
- G. bridge maintenance and repair;
- H. trade ports;
- I. public-private partnerships as a mechanism for transportation infrastructure development;
 - J. high-occupancy vehicle lanes, bike lanes and roundabouts;
 - K. uninsured motorist insurance coverage; and
 - L. consideration of legislation for endorsement.

Legislative Review of Transportation-Related Bills and Financial Overview and 2025 Outlook of the Department of Transportation (DOT) (9:49 a.m.)

Ricky Serna, secretary, DOT, provided an overview of legislation impacting the DOT and transportation in New Mexico, including differences between the executive budget recommendations and the passed budget. Michael Morrison, chief economist, DOT, discussed the forecasted declines in the State Road Fund and possible causes for the declines. Mr. Morrison also discussed how federal policies, such as recently imposed tariffs, could impact the DOT and New Mexico's transportation-based economies. Wednesday, July 16 — Border Authority

Call to Order, Welcome and Introductions (9:23 a.m.)

Representative De La Cruz called the meeting to order and asked subcommittee members and staff to introduce themselves.

Border Highway Connector and Other Border Infrastructure Projects (9:33 a.m.)

Jonathan Macias, assistant county manager, Dona Ana County; Joseph De La Rosa, chair, Board of Directors, Border Authority; and Gerardo Fierro, executive director, Border Authority, presented on the Border Highway Connector and other projects. Mr. Fierro introduced representatives from Mexico and provided an update on the Santa Teresa Port of Entry, through which trade increased by 43% in just one year. Mr. De La Rosa explained how funding provided by the legislature is being used to construct a cargo runway to further develop the foreign trade zone and spoke about the funding gap for completing the Border Highway Connector.

Ricky Serna, secretary, Department of Transportation (DOT), said that the Border Highway Connector no longer has dedicated state funding due to legislation for that funding dying in the 2025 legislative session. He said that while the DOT is working with the Federal Highway Administration to secure an additional \$125 million in federal funds, it is possible that construction will not begin as scheduled in September. Interstate and International Border Infrastructure Updates (10:41 a.m.)

Africa Zepeda, director, Border Affairs, Mexican Ministry of Foreign Relations, said that the modernization of the San Jeronimo-Santa Teresa Border Crossing is a priority for Mexico, especially with the closure of the Bridge of the Americas (BOTA). Eduardo Calvo, executive director, El Paso Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), discussed various projects being

worked on by the El Paso MPO. Hector Ortiz Orpinel, city clerk, City of Juarez, said that with the closing of the BOTA, the city is working on a mobility plan and communicating with various groups for funding. Alberto Nicolas Lopez, Municipal Institute for Research and Planning, City of Juarez, discussed development plans for the Santa Teresa Port of Entry. Violeta Padilla, secretary, Innovation and Economic Development, State of Chihuahua, discussed Plan Mexico, which provides tax incentives to encourage new investments, business relocation and job creation.
