



Square Feet (x1,000)








- bolstered MTGR in Roosevelt and Torrance counties, and ongoing construction projects boosted MTGR in Luna and Dona Ana counties.
- The largest MTGR decline Securred in Eddy and Lea counties due to falling rig counts and reduced drilling activity.
- Internet sales activity resulted in significant gains in out-of-state receipts, as consumer spending shifted online during the stay-at-home order.
