

Fall First-time Degree-Seeking Students Enrolled Between 2010 and 2019 First Generation Status










Headcount Enrollment- Alamogordo - Carlsbad - Doña Ana - Grants









New World of Work: industries where jobs are changing and promising more change

- Tech industries: Al, cyber security, digital media, etc.
- Industries changing as a result of technology: manufacturing, construction, healthcare, agriculture, transportation, education, retail, etc.
- Industries focused on sustainability including renewable energy, sustainable construction, etc.

New World of Work: Adaptations

Community colleges will have to adapt to meet the needs of this new workforce.

- program content
- program design and delivery
- employer engagement

New World of Work: Program Content

- New or developing programs in cyber-security, data analytics, logistics, child development
- A reorganization of non-credit unit to be more responsive to emerging needs in business and industry, e.g. recently licensed CNM's bootcamp, "Deep Dive Coding"
- Increasing integration of other programs to focus on workforce needs (IETs, industry-focused biliteracy academies)
- Ongoing use of industry-recognized credentials and stackable certificates

New World of Work: Program Delivery

Two projects focused on delivery of content using existing and emerging technologies.

- DACC's iPad initiatives
- System's EON-XR adoption/implementation

New World of Work: Program Delivery (DACC's iPad initiatives)

- 2100+ iPads distributed to students
- "Xcite!": an ongoing project to train faculty to use iPad technology in their classrooms
- Apx 50 faculty trained in iPad use for the classroom
- 6 programs are "1:1" iPad use; 4 more in progress

New World of Work: Delivery (EON XR Platform)

virtual reality, augmented reality, and interactive 3D images

- EON XR will increase teaching and learning capacity by making VR/AR/3D available for classroom, laboratory, sitebased, and remote learning environments.
- Apx 40 faculty and staff have gone through initial training.
- Implementation goals and strategies drafted.

New World of Work: Benefits of New Technologies

- economic development: students prepared to enter workforce employees offered opportunity to upskill or reskill
- social mobility: state-of-the-art technologies made available for a university system that serves significant numbers of first-generation and Pell-eligible students
