




### 2005-2019: NEW MEXICO'S HIGHER EDUCATION ENROLLMENT TREND














### **HEADCOUNT OF FRESHMAN AT NEW MEXICO'S RESEARCH INSTITUTIONS**






HIGHER EDUCATION GF APPROPRIATION 💳 — CPI ADJUSTED FY08 DOLLARS

### **INSTRUCTION & GENERAL (I&G) FUNDING FORMULA RECOMMENDATION**

- Our recommendation includes:
  - No redistribution through the I&G Formula for FY22
  - A 2% reduction from the FY21 post-Special Session I&G
  - The restoration of \$20 million of CARES Act Institutional Share before calculating the 2% reduction
- The agency is dedicated to convening stakeholders to review changes to the I&G Funding Formula in the upcoming interim.

# **RESEARCH & PUBLIC SERVICE PROJECTS**

### RESEARCH & PUBLIC SERVICES PROJECTS (RPSP) RECOMMENDATION

- Our recommendation includes:
  - No new RPSPs recommendations in FY22
  - No expansions or discontinuations in FY22
  - A 4% reduction from FY21 post-Special Session for RPSPs
  - Total: \$133.31 million
    - An 8% reduction from the 2020 House Bill 2 appropriations

When I joined the New Mexico Higher Education Department as acting secretary in the late summer, I witnessed firsthand the many challenges facing higher education in our state, and most importantly, the difficulties many students face in accessing and completing a college degree.

There is no question that higher education is valuable to New Mexicans.

Over 30,000 of our citizens graduate from our public colleges and universities with degrees and certificates annually, and a majority of voters have supported higher education initiatives on state and local ballots over the past year.

## WE ARE COMMITTED

### HIGHER EDUCATION'S COVID-19 RESPONSE

- All plans addressed a common set of considerations that ensured adherence to public health and executive orders, embraced implementation of key mitigation strategies, and prepared institutions to respond to COVID-19 cases on campus.
