


CAPITOL BUILDING PLANNING COMMISSION

The State of New Mexico established the CBPC in 1997 as an intergovernmental agency to study and plan for the long-range facility needs of state government

Composition

- Made up of representatives from the executive, legislative, and judicial branches of government and some constitutional officers
- The intent of this broad representation is to ensure participation in the state's long-range facilities planning by major stakeholds.

CURRENT PLANNING ACTIVITIES

Strategic Space Master Plan for GSD/FMD

Ongoing Support to GSD and DolT for the SHARE Location Coding effort

- Monthly updates of GSD/FMD data for incorporation into SHARE by DoIT
 - Support in assignment of new location codes for all agencies
 - Updates to lease changes and location changes in both owned and leased facilities



2021 WORK PLAN

ARC's proposed work plan for the coming year includes:

- Complete GSD/FMD Strategic Space Master Plan
- Continue to Support to GSD and DoIT for monthly updates in support of the SHARE Location Coding effort
- Complete a Comprehensive Update to the Statewide Inventory (last comprehensive update was in 2017)
 - Document recent acquisitions and dispositions
 - Reconcile space assignments to reflect current space usage resulting from lease consolidation activities
 - Expand the Statewide Inventory to include the holdings of the State's 31 Higher Education facilities



Possible Future Efforts

Update existing Area Plans to reflect recent changes

- Update the CBPC Primer
- Update Santa Fe Plan to reflect the current strategic master plan, new facilities and dispositions
- Update Albuquerque Area Plan to reflect changes due to acquisition of CYFD Wellness Center and other moves and acquisitions, and recently completed planning for the Los Lunas Campus
- Update to Las Cruces Area Plan to reflect recent moves/acquisitions
