A Joint Resolution Proposing to Amend the

Constitution of New Mexico:

To provide to the State Ethics Commission the sole authority to review and establish salaries every two years for all elected officers of the legislative, executive and judicial branches of state government;

To remove existing authority to set salaries by law for elected officers of the executive and judicial branches of state government;

To remove existing limitations on and requirements

for legislative compensation; and

To transfer to the supreme court the authority of the legislatively appointed members of the state ethics commission to appoint two members of different parties to the state ethics commission.

Art 5, Sec. 17: D. The state ethics commission shall review and establish the salaries of all elected state officers every two years. The salaries established by the state ethics commission shall be published no later than December 1 of each odd-numbered year and shall be effective the first full pay period of the following fiscal year.

The following constitutional provisions are repealed:

- A. Article 4, Section 10; (legislative compensation)
- B. Article 5, Section 12; (executive salaries)
- C. Article 6, Section 11; (justice salaries)
- D. Article 6, Section 17. (dist. judge salaries)

The following constitutional provisions are amended:

- A. Article 6, Section 24; (dist. atty salaries)
- B. Article 6, Section 26; (magistrate salaries)
- C. Article 6, Section 28. (ct. of appeals salaries)

Why is this not log rolling?

State ex rel. Chavez v. Vigil-Giron, et al,

1988-NMSC-103

¶ 9:"the main inquiry in cases such as this is not how the present Constitution, which stands to be amended, organizes its subject matter. Rather, the question to be answered is whether the legislature reasonably could have determined that a proposed amendment embraces but one object."

¶ 14: "In the present case, the changes proposed are germane to an overarching theme of "judicial reform." . . . . "

¶ 14: "We cannot ignore the rational linchpin that joins the qualifications and merit selection of judges, their numbers, their districting, and the selection of their chief administrative officers...."

¶ I4: "Hence, we conclude that amendment 6 does not violate the provisions of Article XIX, Section I of the Constitution."
