
# NM Ready Grant Fiber Optic Termination

The courses include

- Certified Fiber Optics Technician (CFOT)
- Certified Fiber Optics Testing and Maintenance Specialist (CFOS/T)
- Certified Fiber Optics Specialist in Splicing (CFOS/S)
- Certified Fiber Optics Outside Plant Specialist (CFOS/O)

These four certifications prepare students for any fiber optic positions requiring premise installation, outside installation, splicing or testing.



- Alignment with NMSU Veteran Affairs Programs for seamless experience taking courses at other NMSU Campuses








# Martinez Hall Exterior Stucco 2020 GO Bond
