## **COMMUNITY OF HOPE SCOPE**

- MVCH serves people experiencing homelessness and nearhomelessness with a variety of services:
- Temporary shelter
- Housing assistance
- Income assistance
- Case management
- Behavioral Health Services
- Laundry
- Showers
- Last year we served 2,744 people
- We housed 570 people (including 150 children)

## **VETERAN-SPECIFIC SERVICES**

- Last FY, MVCH served 317 Veterans
- Housing; single site or occupancy at Veterans' Apartment complex; collaboration between MVCH and the MV Public Housing Authority
- Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF): To provide supportive services and referrals for Veterans experiencing homelessness and near-homelessness.
- We housed a Veteran who has been accessing services for 16 years, since 2002. Honorable discharge. He went between the GRM and motels. Came to Camp Hope and was housed within 1.5 months.
- Newly homeless Veterans coming in all the time
- Intervention Supportive Services for Veterans: MVCH has an onsite Licensed Mental Health Therapist that meets with homeless and newly housed Veterans. Last FY, there were 652 visits.

## CHALLENGES


- We used to receive \$22, 300 from the NM Department of Veterans' Services. In May of 2016, I had a visit from Secretary Fox announcing MVCH would no longer receive this grant.
- The City of Las Cruces City Council stepped in and helped with funding that year.
- We have not received support again from the NMDVS.
- Lack of affordable units ready for occupancy in our community;
- COVID assistance

## VETERANS

- Despite the challenges, MVCH has managed to keep its designation as the 13<sup>th</sup> City in the Nation to declare operationally ending Veteran homelessness. This is a declaration that NM should be proud of and should be fighting to maintain.
- MVCH employs a Veteran Preference for programs, especially housing.
- MVCH will continue to serve homeless and near-homeless Veterans. Our homeless heroes deserve a roof over their heads and we will continue to make that a priority.
