

Wastewater Treatment Facility

- Ohkay Owingeh's existing facility is corroding, it only has approximately five remaining years before it fails
- Failure of the existing plant will cause 175,000 gallows of raw sewage and untreated runoff to spill which will result in catastrophic flooding and will cause a serous health hazard
- The existing facility was built 23 years ago in 1998, and consists of an outdoor activated sludge facility with a flow equalization basin and two treatment trains with aeration basins and clarifiers
- Ohkay Owingeh plans to "go green" and will incorporate the approval of the Land Application Use Plan as outlined in the Preliminary Engineering Report (PER)
- The recycled grey water will be treated and utilized in the Pueblo's Outdoor Health and Education Facility (the facility is 42 acres in size and requires 182,405 gallons of effluent per day, therefore, all the Pueblo's effluent will be utilized for baseball, soccer, and softball fields

Outdoor Health & Education Facility

- The construction of the 42-acre Outdoor Health and Education Facility will allow Ohkay Owingeh to offer outdoor classes and curriculum for the Pueblo and surrounding Communities
- The facility will include four softball/baseball fields; two soccer/football fields; basketball courts; batting cages; and a one-mile exercise/education trail
- Water reuse/grey water will be processed and applied to the Outdoor Facility's fields
- The facility is Regional and will benefit all communities in Northern New Mexico



Outdoor Health & Education Facility Funding to Date

- \$2,702,206 Total Project Cost
- \$112,000 2015 NM State Legislature Capital Outlay (Final Design Completed)
- \$810,000 2019 NM State Legislature Capital Outlay (Completed Site preparation and a portion of infrastructure)
- \$500,000 2021 NM State Legislature Capital Outlay (will complete another portion of infrastructure)
- \$1,280,206 Need for Completion


Highway 74/PoPay Ave Intersection Project


- The Intersection is a critical safety concern of Ohkay Owingeh
- The Ohkay Owingeh Chief of Police certified that there were 1,112 citations issued over the past five years
- Over the past 10 years there have been 24 crashes at the Intersection
- Average Daily Traffic (ADT) counts are currently 10,038
 vehciles per day (please note that this current ADT count
 was during COVID shut-downs; school was not in session)!

Storm/Surface Water Control System

- Ohkay Owingeh has experienced catastrophic flooding in the past several years causing families to be displaced, businesses to close, and major deterioration to our infrastructure systems (water/wastewater systems; roadways)



Education Complex Community Wellness Center

- Ohkay Owingeh and the surrounding communities lack sufficient access to wellness and community center facilities
- Diabetes has increased by 5% in our Community in the past five years due to lack of physical exercise, diabetes prevention and intervention
- Childhood obesity for children ages 8 to 12 years old is 18%; and 24% of the youth in our Community are overweight or obese by the time they enter high school.
- 14% of our total population has been diagnosed with Type II Diabetes





Ohkay Owingeh Transit Facility

Ohkay Owingeh operates a Public Transit Service named the "PoPay Messenger Program"

The program serves over 12,000 individuals per year in the Pueblo and surrounding communities; the focus is on social-services related appointments, medical appointments, education transports, and senior shopping/personal assistance.

Ohkay Owingeh does not currently have an ADA accessible building to serve our community

The Pueblo was successful in securing funding from the Federal Transit Administration – "Bus and Bus Facilities Program" in 2021; and our new facility is currently under construction and will be completed in August 2021




