




Historically, consumer settlement revenues were not a major source of funds for the Office of the Attorney General operating budget. It was in fiscal year 2011 that consumer settlement funds began to be used for the operating budget in a substantial way.





Consumer fund revenues are based on lawsuits and are therefore inherently volatile. Some lawsuits do not even result in revenues to the consumer fund. Instead, they provide restitution to New Mexican families and consumers, or directly to the State.







