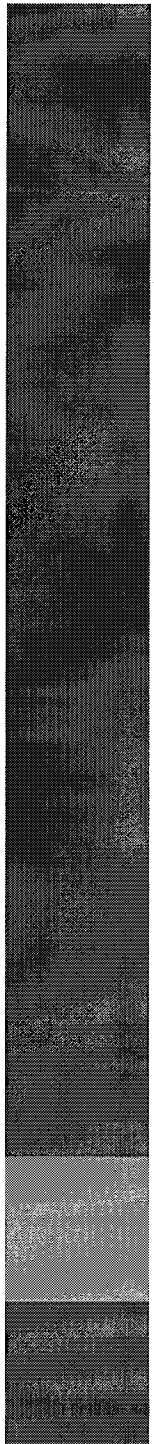

Pre-JDAI BCYSC History

- 1993 – BCJDC bed capacity was 48
- 1994 -Added 15-bed unit completed
 - Bed capacity increased to 63
- 1996 Added 15-bed unit completed
 - Bed capacity increased to 78
- 1994 – 1998
 - BCJDC population increases
- 1998
 - 50-65% staff turnover rate
 - Unsafe conditions
 - Traditional correctional training
 - Special needs population

What is JDAI?

- **The Annie E. Casey Foundation is a private charitable organization, dedicated to helping build better futures for disadvantaged children.**
- **Established in 1948 by Jim Casey, one of the founders of United Parcel Service (UPS).**
- **Launched in 1992, JDAI focuses on the detention component of the juvenile justice system because youth are often unnecessarily or inappropriately detained at great expense, with long lasting negative consequences for both public safety and youth development.**

PURPOSE:

To demonstrate that jurisdictions can establish more effective and efficient systems to accomplish the purposes of juvenile detention.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1) Eliminate inappropriate or unnecessary use of secure detention
- 2) Minimize failures to appear and incidence of delinquent behavior
- 3) Redirect public finances to successful reform strategies
- 4) Improve conditions in secure detention facilities
- 5) Reduce racial and ethnic disparities

Alternatives to detention

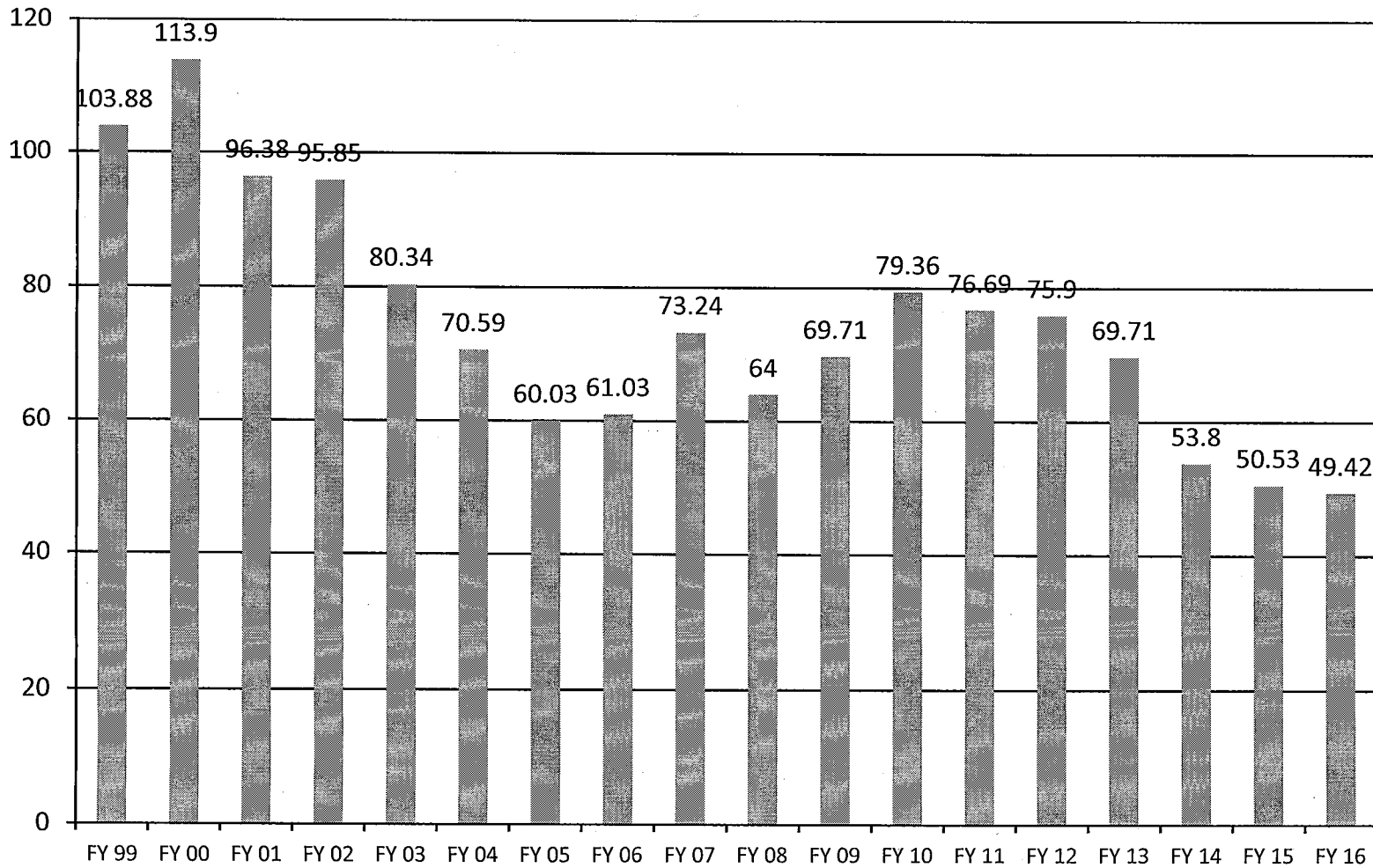
Case processing reforms
