


Sexual Abuse Education & Prevention

Our team of trained specialists in prevention are available to present to:

- Elementary Schools • Middle Schools • High Schools
- Child Care Centers • Religious Organizations
- Community Groups • Non-Profit Agencies
- Businesses

We offer services to help prevent violence and promote behaviors that create safer environments. Topics include:

- Mandatory reporting of child abuse or neglect
- Healthy relationships to reduce teen dating violence and stalking
- Helping children to determine body boundaries
- Recognizing child abuse in children
- Anti-Bullying training
- Diversity and acceptance training
- Understanding and combating human trafficking



Resources for Survivors of Violent Crimes (FAC)

The Family Advocacy Center provides support and guidance to individuals, children and families who have experienced or witnessed violent crimes including sexual assault.

The FAC is an accredited member of the National Children's Alliance and a member of the New Mexico Safe House Network.

- Case tracking and coordinating for victims of violent crimes
- Forensic interviewing of children
- Court monitoring of sexual assault cases

We work with law enforcement, the judiciary, social services and other community providers to ensure families receive full access to needed resources.

Clinical Services

We provide crisis stabilization, assessment and therapy to reduce symptoms such as:

- Distressing memories
- Feeling like the trauma is happening again
- Not feeling safe
- Numbness or withdrawal
- Trouble sleeping
- Irritability or outbursts of anger
- Trouble calming down

Benefits of our services include:

- Restoring a sense of safety and control
- Learning coping skills for anxiety and stress
- Collaborating with each individual to meet their unique needs

Employer, school, and first responder training for stress management and awareness is available.
