Work Plan

On April 17, 2026, the New Mexico Legislative Council created the Federal Funding Stabilization and Affordability Subcommittee for a second year and added affordability to the subcommittee's purview.

During the 2026 interim, as time permits, the subcommittee proposes to:

- A. review the magnitude and role of federal funds in New Mexico's budget, economy, local governments and households and how and when those funds are disbursed to the state;
- B. monitor federal actions, including executive orders, rulemaking and grant allocations, that could impact the distribution of previously approved or budgeted federal funding;
- C. receive updates on mid-year economic developments that have timing impacts outside of the regular budget development cycle;
- D. follow the formulation, expected impacts and implementation of new federal laws, rule changes and administrative actions;
- E. closely examine special high-impact areas, such as the effects of federal tax changes on New Mexico families and businesses; and
- F. assess major and beyond-trend developments in affordability pressures in New Mexico, including costs related to food, housing, health care, energy and workforce availability.
