AL., v. Maggie Tolouse Oliver, 14 ET. AL., D-506-CV-2022-041; and 15 WHEREAS, in light of the requirements of public business, the Chief 16 Justice having determined that it would be in the best interests of judicial economy and the expeditious disposition of the foregoing case to designate the 17 18 Honorable Fred T. Van Soelen to preside over said case; 19 NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to the authority of 20 the Chief Justice under Article VI, Sections 3 and 15, of the Constitution of the 21 State of New Mexico, Hon. Fred T. Van Soelen is designated to preside over 22 Republican Party of New Mexico, ET. AL., v. Maggie Tolouse Oliver, ET. AL., 23 D-506-CV-2022-041; which is pending on the docket of the Fifth District Court; 24 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Judge Van Soelen may be reimbursed 25 for mileage and per diem, provided that such costs are paid directly by the Fifth

Judicial District Court;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, should this case remain pending on the docket of the Fifth Judicial District Court after Judge Van Soelen is no longer a sitting district judge in the Ninth Judicial District Court, this case shall be automatically reassigned to the new judge selected to replace Judge Noel in Division III of the Ninth Judicial District Court; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Fifth Judicial District Court shall provide a copy of this order to the parties to the case referenced in this order.
