SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 122 appropriates \$87.0 from the general fund to the department of finance and administration for FY01. The bill proposes to fund a statewide citizen review board program to meet the expanding caseload demands of reviewing cases of child abuse and neglect.

Significant Issues

The current version of HB-2 includes \$418.6 in general fund for the citizen review board, of which \$310.0 is general fund and \$108.6 is from the Children, Youth and Families department, an \$80.0 increase over the current fiscal year. The additional funding proposed in this legislation would enhance the current program level .

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

House Bill 122 appropriates \$87.0 from the general fund and is recurring.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The department of finance and administration currently administer the program and the impact to the department would be minimal.
