WHEREAS, all units of government, large and small corporations, nonprofit organizations, religious organizations and local businesses of all sizes require accurate information on population and family size and income data for investments, job development and marketing guidance to determine the impact of educational, health and social programs; and

WHEREAS, individual and family information is held completely confidential by strong federal laws supported by consistent court rulings at all levels and is never released except in large statistical totals or to family members after seventy-two years for genealogical purposes; and

WHEREAS, census 2000 in New Mexico is being carried out under the able leadership of Fernando E. C de Baca in Albuquerque, Arlene Roybal in Las Cruces and Francisco Apodaca in Santa Fe, distinguished native New Mexicans;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that endorsement and support be extended to the United States census bureau as it conducts a complete and accurate count of all New Mexico
