2	MAKING GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES BY STATE AGENCIES REQUIRED BY LAW.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
4	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the "General Appropriation Act of 2000".
5	Section 2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the General Appropriation Act of 2000:
6	A. "agency" means an office, department, agency, institution, board, bureau, commission,
7	court, district attorney, council or committee of state government;
8	B. "expenditures" means costs, expenses, encumbrances and other financing uses, other than
9	refunds authorized by law, recognized in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for the
10	legally authorized budget amounts and budget period;
11	C. "federal funds" means any payments by the United States government to state government or
12	agencies except those payments made in accordance with the federal Mineral Lands Leasing Act;
13	D. "full-time equivalent" or "FTE" means one or more authorized positions that together
14	receive compensation for not more than two thousand eighty hours worked in fiscal year 2001. The
15	calculation of hours worked includes compensated absences but does not include overtime, compensatory time
16	or sick leave paid pursuant to Section 10-7-10 NMSA 1978;
17	E. "general fund" means that fund created by Section 6-4-2 NMSA 1978 and includes federal
18	Mineral Lands Leasing Act receipts and those payments made in accordance with the federal block grant and
19	the federal Workforce Investment Act, but excludes the general fund operating reserve and the
20	appropriation contingency fund;
21	F. "interagency transfers" means revenue, other than internal service funds, legally
22	transferred from one agency to another;
23	G. "internal service funds" means:
24	(1) revenue transferred to an agency for the financing of goods or services to another
25	agency on a cost-reimbursement basis; and

- 1 (2) unencumbered balances in agency internal service fund accounts appropriated by the 2 General Appropriation Act of 2000;
- 3

H. "other state funds" means:

4 (1) unencumbered, nonreverting balances in agency accounts, other than in internal
5 service funds accounts, appropriated by the General Appropriation Act of 2000;

6 (2) all revenue available to agencies from sources other than the general fund, internal
7 service funds, interagency transfers and federal funds; and

8

(3) all revenue, the use of which is restricted by statute or agreement;

9 I. "revenue" means all money received by an agency from sources external to that agency, net 10 of refunds and other correcting transactions, other than from issue of debt, liquidation of investments or 11 as agent or trustee for other governmental entities or private persons; and

J. "unforeseen federal funds" means a source of federal funds or an increased amount of federal funds that could not have been reasonably anticipated or known during the second special session of the forty-fourth legislature and, therefore, could not have been requested by an agency or appropriated by the legislature.

16 Section 3. GENERAL PROVISIONS.--

17

A. Amounts set out under column headings are expressed in thousands of dollars.

B. Amounts set out under column headings are appropriated from the source indicated by the
 column heading. All amounts set out under the column heading "Internal Service Funds/Interagency
 Transfers" indicate an intergovernmental transfer and do not represent a portion of total state government
 appropriations. All information designated as "Totals" or "Subtotals" are provided for information and
 are not appropriations.

C. Amounts set out in Section 4 of the General Appropriation Act of 2000, or so much as may
 be necessary, are appropriated from the indicated source for expenditure in fiscal year 2001 for the
 objects expressed.

D. Unencumbered balances in agency accounts remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the general fund by October 1, 2000, unless otherwise indicated in the General Appropriation Act of 2000 or otherwise provided by law.

E. Unencumbered balances in agency accounts remaining at the end of fiscal year 2001 shall
revert to the general fund by October 1, 2001, unless otherwise indicated in the General Appropriation Act
of 2000 or otherwise provided by law.

F. The state budget division shall monitor revenue received by agencies from sources other than the general fund and shall reduce the operating budget of any agency whose revenue from such sources is not meeting projections. The state budget division shall notify the legislative finance committee of any operating budget reduced pursuant to this subsection.

G. Except as otherwise specifically stated in the General Appropriation Act of 2000, appropriations are made in that act for the expenditures of agencies and for other purposes as required by existing law for fiscal year 2001. If any other act of the second special session of the forty-fourth legislature changes existing law with regard to the name or responsibilities of an agency or the name or purpose of a fund or distribution, the appropriation made in the General Appropriation Act of 2000 shall be transferred from the agency, fund or distribution to which an appropriation has been made as required by existing law to the appropriate agency, fund or distribution provided by the new law.

18 H. In August, October, December and May of fiscal year 2001, the department of finance and 19 administration, in consultation with the staff of the legislative finance committee and other agencies, 20 shall prepare and present revenue estimates to the legislative finance committee. If these revenue 21 estimates indicate that revenues and transfers to the general fund, excluding transfers to the general 22 fund operating reserve, the appropriation contingency fund or the state-support reserve fund, as of the 23 end of fiscal year 2001, are not expected to meet appropriations from the general fund, then the 24 department shall present a plan to the legislative finance committee that outlines the methods by which 25 the administration proposes to address the deficit.

1 I. Pursuant to Sections 6-3-23 through 6-3-25 NMSA 1978, agencies whose revenue from 2 unforeseen federal funds, from state board of finance loans, from revenue appropriated by other acts of 3 the legislature, or from gifts, grants donations, bequests, insurance settlements, refunds, or payments 4 into revolving funds exceed specifically appropriated amounts may request budget increases from the state 5 budget division. If approved by the state budget division, such money is appropriated. In approving a 6 budget increase from unforeseen federal funds, the director of the state budget division shall advise the 7 legislative finance committee as to the source of the federal funds and the source and amount of any 8 matching funds required.

9 J. For fiscal year 2001, the number of permanent and term full-time equivalent positions 10 specified for each agency shows the maximum number of employees intended by the legislature for that 11 agency, unless another provision of the General Appropriation Act of 2000 or another act of the second 12 special session of the forty-fourth legislature provides for additional employees.

13 K. Except for gasoline credit cards used solely for operation of official vehicles and 14 telephone credit cards used solely for official business, none of the appropriations contained in the 15 General Appropriation Act of 2000 may be expended for payment of credit card invoices.

16 L. To prevent unnecessary spending, expenditures from the General Appropriation Act of 2000 17 for gasoline for state-owned vehicles at public gasoline service stations shall be made only for 18 self-service gasoline; provided that a state agency head may provide exceptions from the requirement to 19 accommodate disabled persons or for other reasons the public interest may require.

20 M. When approving operating budgets based on appropriations in the General Appropriation Act 21 of 2000, the state budget division is specifically authorized to approve only those budgets that are in 22 accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for the purpose of properly classifying other 23 financing sources and uses, including interfund, intrafund and interagency transfers.

N. No money appropriated in the General Appropriation Act of 2000 shall be used to promote
 the legalization or decriminalization of controlled substances.

16 Upon certification by the state board of finance pursuant to Section 6-1-2 NMSA 1978 that a critical 17 emergency exists that cannot be addressed by disaster declaration or other emergency or contingency 18 funds, and upon review by the legislative finance committee, the secretary of finance and administration 19 is authorized to transfer from the general fund operating reserve to the state board of finance emergency 20 fund the amount necessary to meet the emergency. The department of health shall report to the appropriate legislative 18 interim committee on a regular basis on the design and implementation of its tobacco cessation program, 19 including information on how the program will reach all children in the state and other elements of the 20 program.

21 The appropriation to the public health division is contingent upon the department of health 22 maintaining the Rural Primary Health Care Act contracts at no less than the fiscal year 2000 appropriated 23 level.

24 The general fund appropriation to the public health division of the department of health in the 25 contractual services category is contingent upon limiting the use of contracted temporary staff to

17 year; and then upon verification of the number of units statewide for fiscal year 2001, but no later than 18 January 31, the superintendent of public instruction may adjust the program unit value.

19 The legislature encourages local school districts to develop and implement school-based art 20 programs.

The appropriation for the state equalization guarantee contains sufficient funds to provide a six and one-fourth percent salary increase for teachers, a five percent increase for other instructional staff and a four percent salary increase for other certified and noncertified staff, including transportation employees. Prior to distributing the funds for salaries to any school district, the superintendent of public instruction shall verify that the school district is providing a minimum of one hundred eighty

1 instructional days or the equivalent if the district is operating a variable school calendar, exclusive of 2 any release time, and require that each local school board provide the equivalent of two additional 3 contract days above the one hundred eighty days for professional development.

4 Included in the state equalization guarantee are sufficient funds for funding additional program 5 units for the purpose of early literacy programs for students in first and second grades not reading at 6 grade level. The state department of public education shall distribute funds, upon program approval, to 7 school districts for schools with the highest proportion of students in need. The department shall 8 develop quidelines that include pre- and post-program assessments to evaluate the effectiveness of the 9 program. The department shall distribute funds based on the number of program units determined by 10 multiplying the number of children in the early literacy program by the cost differential factor .053. If 11 the department determines that a program is not meeting the benchmarks necessary to ensure the progress of 12 students in the program, the department shall notify the school district that failure to meet the 13 benchmarks within sixty days will result in the cessation of funding for the program. The department 14 shall provide a progress report in December 2000 and a final report in August 2001 on the program to the

15 legislative education study committee and the legislative finance committee.

16 For the 2000-2001 school year, the appropriation for the state equalization guarantee distribution 17 includes sufficient funding for districts implementing a formula-based program for the first time. Those 18 districts shall use current MEM in the calculation of program units for the new formula-based program.

19 The general fund appropriation in the state equalization guarantee distribution reflects the 20 deduction of federal revenues pursuant to Paragraph (2) of Subsection C of Section 22-8-25 NMSA 1978 that 21 includes payments commonly known as "impact aid funds" pursuant to 20 USCA 7701 et seq., formerly known 22 as "PL 874 funds".

The general fund appropriation to the public school fund shall be reduced by the amounts transferred to the public school fund from the current school fund and from the federal Mineral Lands Leasing Act receipts otherwise unappropriated.
