20	A. For the purpose of minimizing or eliminating
21	damage from floods or mudslides in <u>federal emergency</u>
22	management agency and locally designated flood-prone areas,
23	and for the purpose of promoting health, safety and the
24	general welfare, a county or municipality may by ordinance:
25	(1) designate and regulate flood plain areas
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1 having special flood or mudslide hazards; 2 (2)prescribe standards for constructing, 3 altering, installing or repairing buildings and other 4 improvements under a permit system within a designated flood or mudslide hazard area: 5 (3) require approval by the local flood plain 6 7 manager for development within a designated flood or mudslide 8 hazard area; 9 [(3)] (4) review subdivision proposals and 10 other new developments within a designated flood or mudslide hazard area to [assure] ensure that: 11 12 (a) all such proposals are consistent 13 with the need to minimize flood damage; 14 **(b)** all public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical and water systems are designed 15 to minimize or eliminate flood damage; and 16 17 (c) adequate drainage is provided so as 18 to reduce exposure to flood hazards; 19 [(4)] (5) require new or replacement water 20 supply systems or sanitary sewage systems within a designated 21 flood or mudslide hazard area to be designed to minimize or 22 eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and 23 discharges from the systems into flood waters and require on-24 site waste disposal systems to be located so as to avoid 25 impairment of them or contamination from them during flooding; . 133562. 1

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and

[(5)] <u>(6)</u> designate and regulate floodways for the passage of flood waters.

B. [Any] <u>A flood plain</u> ordinance adopted pursuant to this section shall substantially conform to the minimum standards prescribed by the federal insurance administration, regulation 1910 issued pursuant to Subsection 7(d), 79 Stat.
670, Section 1361, 82 Stat. 587 and 82 Stat. 575, all as amended.

<u>C. A county or municipality that enacts a flood</u> plain ordinance shall designate a person, certified pursuant to the national flood insurance program, as the flood plain manager to administer the flood plain ordinance.

[C.] D. A county or municipality shall have exclusive jurisdiction over <u>flood plain</u> permits issued under its respective <u>flood plain</u> ordinance and in accordance with this section and so long as it is enforced by an approved inspector pursuant to the Construction Industries Licensing Act. Notwithstanding Section [<u>14-17-5 NMSA 1953</u>] <u>3-18-6 NMSA</u> <u>1978</u>, when a municipality adopts [an] a flood plain ordinance pursuant to Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of this section, the municipality's jurisdiction under [<u>this</u>] <u>the flood plain</u> ordinance shall take precedence over a respective county <u>flood</u> <u>plain</u> ordinance within the municipality's boundary and within the municipality's subdividing and platting jurisdiction.

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1 [D.] E. A county or municipality shall designate flood plain areas having special flood or mudslide hazards in 2 3 substantial conformity with areas identified as flood- or 4 mudslide-prone by the federal insurance administration 5 pursuant to the national flood insurance program. [E.] F. A municipality or county adopting [any] a 6 7 flood plain ordinance pursuant to this section may enter into reciprocal agreements with any agency of the state, other 8 9 political subdivisions or the federal government in order to 10 effectively carry out the provisions of this section. 11 [F.] G. Within their respective jurisdiction, [the 12 environmental improvement agency] the department of public safety, the department of environment or the construction 13 14 industries [commission] division of the regulation and 15 licensing department may assist counties or municipalities 16 when requested by a county or municipality to provide technical advice and assistance." 17 18 - 4 -19 20 21 22 23 24 25

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
