17	"22-2-8.7. CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS
18	A. The state board shall require any person
19	seeking certification in elementary [and] <u>or</u> secondary
20	education to complete the following minimum requirements in
21	the college of arts and sciences:
22	(1) twelve hours in English;
23	(2) twelve hours in history, including
24	American history and western civilization;
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1	(3) six hours in mathematics;
2	(4) six hours in government, economics or
3	soci ol ogy;
4	(5) twelve hours in science, including
5	biology, chemistry, physics, geology, zoology and botany; and
6	(6) six hours in fine arts.
7	B. In addition to the requirements specified in
8	Subsection A of this section, the state board shall require
9	<u>that a person seeking standard or alternative elementary</u>
10	certification shall have completed six hours of reading
11	<u>courses, and a person seeking standard or alternative</u>
12	secondary certification shall have completed three hours of
13	<u>reading courses in subject matter content.</u>
14	[B.] <u>C.</u> The state board shall require, prior to
15	certification, no less than fourteen weeks of student
16	teaching, a portion of which shall occur in the first thirty

credit hours taken in the college of education and shall be under the direct supervision of a certified school instructor and a portion of which shall occur in the student's senior year with the student teacher being directly responsible for the classroom

[C.] <u>D.</u> Nothing in this section shall preclude the state board from establishing or accepting equivalent requirements for purposes of reciprocal certification or
