RELATI NG TO HEALTH; EXPANDI NG COVERAGE FOR CHI LDREN W TH CATASTROPHI C, LI FE-THREATENI NG OR CHRONI C I LLNESSES OR CONDI TI ONS; AMENDI NG A SECTI ON OF THE NMEA 1978.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEG SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 27-12-6 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1998, Chapter 52, Section 6) is amended to read:
" 27-12-6. PLAN CONTENT- - REQUI RED ELEMENTS. - - The chil d heal th pl an and the programof services to be provided by it shal I incl ude:
A. appropriate methods of outreach to increase the enrol I ment of el i gi ble children;
B. [a-"phase one" that shall include providing]
provision of heal th insurance to children living in househol ds at or bel ow two hundred thirty-five percent of the federal . 134284. 1
poverty level;
C. [a "phase two"] a program that may consi st of those feder ally approved specialized services incl uded in the child health plan by the secretary, a continum of prevention and intervention services that may be devel oped and i mpl emented, incl uding appl ications for any feder al wai vers of conditions that are necessary and consisting of at least the foll owing:
(1) i mpl ementation of a vol unt ary home vi siting program available statewi de for mothers having thei $r$ first [ehild] children, begi nning during pregnancy and extending for two years, with a frequency of use as indi cated by maternal desire and home visiting team recomendations;
(2) provision for home- and commity-based early intervention devel opment al services;
(3) provi si on for a behavi or al heal th identification, assessment and management system,
(4) provi si on for school-based heal th servi ces in the net work of heal th care prograns;
(5) provision for the exi sting heal thi er kids fund admini stered by the department of heal th to enable children to have effective access to heal th care;
(6) devel opment of ways to increase children's dental services, incl udi ng such prevention servi ces as periodi c exami nations, radi ographs, prophyl actic cl eani ngs, . 134284. 1
fluoride treat ments and seal ants; and
(7) devel opment of ways to increase children's vi si on servi ces, incl uding periodic professional eye exami nations and prescription eyeware;
D. expanded coverage for children who suffer from cat astrophic, life-threatening or si gni ficant chronic ill nesses or conditions who have lost el igi bility because of age I imits under Title 19 or Title 21 of the federal Social Security Act. The expanded coverage, pursuant to a federal wai ver that the department shall request, shall continue for the child through age twenty-one or earlier if he becomes el igible for federal supplemental security income;
[D.] E. provision for inhibiting or preventing both empl oyer crowd- out and empl oyee crowd-in;
[E.] F. requi rements that in the devel opment and implementation of the pl an the interests of Native American children are identified and that appropriate provisions for thei $r$ enrollment are made with recognition that the application process and the del ivery of services with respect to those children present special cultural and other consi der at i ons;
[F.] G. provisi on for coordi nation of the administration of the programwith other public and private heal th programs;

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met hods, incl udi ng monitoring used to ensure the qual ity and appropriateness of care, particularly with respect to well baby care, well child care and i mmuni zations provi ded pursuant to the plan and to ensure access to covered services, i ncl uding emer gency servi ces;
[H.] I. methods by which the state will collect data, mai nt ai $n$ the records and furni sh requi red reports to the secretary or his desi gnees;
[Ғ] L. specific requi rements for and description of the means to be used to ensure that menbers of the publ ic will be invol ved in the design and implementation of the plan and a description of a method to ensure ongoing public i nvol vement; and
[ち.] K. operation and management of the program by the department in the most fiscally responsi ble manner, subject to all available legi slative appropriations and federal contributions for the program so that low-income children and thei $r$ families recei ve the optimm heal th care possi ble."
