AN ACT
RELATI NG TO EDUCATI ON; REMOVI NG CERTAI $N$ GRADUATI ON REQUI REMENTS FOR STUDENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGI SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 22-2-8. 4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986, Chapter 33, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:
"22-2-8. 4. GRADUATI ON REQUI REMENTS. --
A. At the end of the ei ghth grade or during the ni nth grade, each student shall prepare an i ndi vi dual program of study for grades ni ne through twel ve. The program of st udy shall be si gned by a student's parent or guardian.
B. [Beginning with students entering the ninth grade in the 1986-87 school year] Successful compl etion of a mi ni mum of twenty-three units shall be required for graduation. These units shall be as follows:
(1) four units in English, with maj or emphasis on grammar and liter at ure;
(2) three units in mathematics;
(3) two units in science, one of whi ch shal I have a laborat ory component;
(4) three units in social science, whi ch shall incl ude United St ates hi story and geography, world hi story and geography, and gover nment and economics;
(5) one unit in physical fitness;
[(6) one unit in commuication skills, with frijor emphasis on writing and speaking, which may include a tanguage ot her than English] and
[(7) nine] (6) ten el ective units. Onl y the following el ective units shall be counted toward meeting the requi rements for graduation: fine arts, i.e., music, band, chorus and art; practical arts; physical education; languages ot her than English; speech; drama; vocational education; mathemat ics; sci ence; Engl ish; R. O. T. C. ; soci al sci ence; computer sci ence; heal th education; American si gn I anguage; and other el ectives approved by the state board.

Wth the approval of the local school board, participation on athletic teamor in an at ic sport during the school day may count toward fulfillment of the physi cal education requi red unit.

B. Beginning with students entering the nint $h$ grade in the 1986-87 school year] C. No student shall receive a hi gh school di plom who has not passed a state competency examination in the subject areas of reading, English, math, sci ence and soci al sci ence. [Begi nning with the 1996-97 school year] The state compet ency exam nations on social science shall include a section on the [eonstitution of the] United States constitution and the constitution of New Mexico. If a student exits from the school system at the end of grade twel ve wi thout having passed a state competency exami nation, he shall recei ve an appropriate state certificate indicating the number of credits earned and the grade completed. If within five years after a student exits fromthe school system he takes and passes the state competency examination, he may recei ve a hi gh school di pl oma.
[E.] D. The state board may establish a policy to provi de for administrative inter pretations to clarify curricular and testing provisions of the Public School Code. "
