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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. A new section of Chapter 21, Article 11 NMSA
18	1978 is enacted to read:
19	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] INSTITUTE FOR COMPLEX ADDITIVE SYSTEMS
20	ANALYSIS ESTABLISHEDFUNCTION OF INSTITUTE
21	A. The board of regents of the New Mexico
22	institute of mining and technology shall establish an
23	institute for complex additive systems analysis.
24	B. The function of the institute for complex
25	additive systems analysis is to:
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1 (1) offer formal degree programs that 2 integrate components of the computer science, engineering and 3 management departments at the New Mexico institute of mining 4 and technology; 5 (2)use joint faculty appointments and fellowships to recruit teachers from the ranks of academia, 6 7 government and private industry; 8 perform basic research and applied (3) research for the purpose of analyzing and understanding 9 10 complex interdependent systems; use research developed at the institute 11 (4) 12 to help solve issues regarding complex interdependent systems 13 that arise in the public and private sectors; and 14 (5) stimulate commerce by serving as an information age extension service for New Mexico businesses." 15 16 APPROPRIATION. -- Three hundred fifty thousand Section 2. 17 dollars (\$350,000) is appropriated from the general fund to 18 the board of regents at the New Mexico institute of mining and 19 technology for expenditure in fiscal year 2002 for the purpose 20 of funding work performed by the institute for complex 21 additive systems analysis. Any unexpended or unencumbered 22 balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2002 shall revert 23 to the general fund. 24 Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the

provisions of this act is July 1, 2001.

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
