17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	Section 1. A new section of Chapter 22, Article 2 NMSA
19	1978 is enacted to read:
20	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL]</u> MANDATORY SUPPLEMENTAL READING
21	INSTRUCTION FOR STUDENTS NOT READING AT GRADE LEVEL
22	A. A school district shall require the curriculum
23	of grades two through twelve to include supplemental reading
24	instruction designed to improve a student's reading
25	proficiency to his grade level. The number of classes offered
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in a school shall be sufficient to enroll all students
mandated to participate in supplemental reading instruction
pursuant to Subsection B of this section.

B. Before the end of each school year, but no later than April 1, all students in grades one through eleven shall be administered a test to determine the student's reading ability. The test shall be approved by the department of education and shall be designed to determine whether a student is reading at grade level. A student who is determined not to be reading at grade level shall be enrolled in the following school year in a supplemental course of reading instruction.

C. Failure to read at grade level at the end of a school year shall not be by itself a reason for not promoting a student."

Section 2. Section 22-2-6.12 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2000 (2nd S.S.), Chapter 14, Section 2) is amended to read:

"22-2-6.12. PUBLIC SCHOOL READING PROFICIENCY FUND--CREATED.--The "public school reading proficiency fund" is created in the state treasury. The fund shall consist of appropriations, gifts, grants and donations. The fund shall be administered by the [state] department of [public] education, and money in the fund is appropriated to the department to provide supplemental reading instruction for students who do not read at grade level and to distribute

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1 awards to local schools that implement innovative, research-2 based reading programs. The [state] department of [public] 3 education shall develop procedures and rules for the application and award of money from the fund, including 4 5 criteria upon which to evaluate innovative, research-based 6 reading programs. Disbursements of the fund shall be made by 7 warrant of the department of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the superintendent of public 8 9 instruction. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining 10 in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not revert but 11 shall remain to the credit of the fund." 12 - 3 -13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 . 134154. 4

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
