be it enacted by the legl slature of the state of new mexi co:
Section 1. Section 22-2-8. 2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986, Chapter 33, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
"22-2-8.2. STAFFI NG PATTERNS- - CLASS LOAD - TEACHI NG LOAD. -
A. The indivi dual class load for el ementary school teachers shall not exceed twenty students for ki ndergarten; provi ded that any teacher in kindergarten with a class Ioad of fifteen to twenty students shall recei ve the assistance of an instructional assistant.
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[B. The average el ass load for element ary-schoot teachers at an individual school shall not exceed twenty-t wo students when averaged arong grades one, two and three; provided that any teacher in grade one with a class load of t went y one or more shall be entitled to the full-time assistance of an instructional assistant.]
B. The i ndi vi dual cl ass l oad for el ement ary school teachers shall not exceed twenty students for grade one and twent y-two students for grades two and three; provided that a teacher in grade one with a class load of twenty or grades two and three with class loads of twent y-two shall recei ve the full-time assistance of an instructional assistant. An el ement ary teacher who recei ves the full-time assistance of an instructional assistant in accordance with the provisions of this subsection has the option of retaining the instructional assi stant if the class load decreases during the course of the school year.
C. Effective with the 1994-95 school year, the average class load for an el ementary school teacher at an i ndi vi dual school shall not exceed twenty-four students when averaged among grades four, five and six.
D. The daily teaching load per teacher for grades seven through twel ve shall not exceed one hundred sixty st udents, except the daily teaching load for teachers of requi red English courses in grades seven and ei ght shall not . 134450. 2
exceed one hundred thirty-five with a maximum of twenty-seven st udents per class and the daily teaching load for teachers of requi red English courses in grades ni ne through twel ve shal not exceed one hundred fifty students with a maximum of thirty st udents per class.
E. Students recei ving special education services integrated into a regul ar classroomfor any part of the day shall be counted in the cal cul ation of cl ass load averages. St udents recei ving special education services not integrated into the regul ar classroomshall not be counted in the cal cul ation of class load averages. Onl y cl assroomteachers charged with responsi bility for the regul ar classroom instructional programshall be counted in determing average cl ass loads. In el ement ary school s of fering only one grade level, the class loads for ki ndergarten, first, second and third grades shall reflect the class load requi rements set forth in Subsections $A$ and $B$ of this section. In el ementary school s offering onl y one grade level, average class loads for grades four, five and six may be cal cul at ed by averaging appropriate grade levels [betw] anong schools in the school district.
F. The state [superintendent] board may wai ve the i ndi vi dual school class load requi rements [established in this section] for grades four, five and six. Wai vers shall be applied for annually and a wai ver shall not be granted for . 134450. 2
more than two consecutive years. Wai vers may only be granted if a school district demonstrates:
(1) no portable cl assroons are available;
(2) no ot her available sources of funding exist to meet its need for additional classrooms;
(3) the di strict is planning alternatives to increase buil ding capacity for implementat on with one year; and
(4) the parents of all children affected by the wai ver have been notified in writing:
(a) of the stat ut ory class I oad requi rements;
(b) that the school district has made a deci si on to devi ate fromthese class load requi rements; and
(c) of the school district plan to achi eve compliance with the class load requi rements.
G. If a wai ver is granted pursuant to Subsection $F$ of thi s section to an indi vidual school, the average class I oad for el ement ary school teachers at that school shall not exceed [ twenty students in grade one and shall not exceed twent y-five students when averaged anong grades two, three, four, five and six] twenty-ei ght students.
H. Each school district shall report to the department of education the size and composition of cl asses subsequent to the fortieth day and the December 1 count.

Failure to meet class load requi rements within two years shall be justification for the di sapproval of the school district's budget by the state superintendent.
I. The department of education shall report to the I egi slative education study committee by November 30 of each year regarding each school di strict's ability to meet class load requi rements i mposed by I aw.
J. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection F of thi s section, the state board may wai ve the indi vi dual cl ass load and teaching load requi rements establ ished in this section upon a demonstration of a viable alternative curricular pl an and a finding by the state board that the pl an is in the best interest of the school district and that, on an annual basis, the plan has been presented to and is supported by the affected teaching staff. The department of education shal l eval uate the i mpact of each alternative curricular pl an annually. Annual reports shall be made to the legi slative education study committee.

## K. [Effective with the 1987-88-school year]

Certified school instructors shall not be requi red to perform noni nstructional duties except in emer gency situations as defined by the state board. For purposes of this subsection, "noni nstructional duties" means noon hall duty, noon ground duty and noon cafeteria duty."
