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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 61-6-13 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989,
17	Chapter 269, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"61-6-13. LICENSURE BY ENDORSEMENT
19	A. The board may grant a license without
20	examination and by endorsement to an applicant who has been a
21	licensed physician outside of New Mexico, but in the United
22	States, and who otherwise meets the requirements set forth in
23	the Medical Practice Act, provided that the applicant is
24	properly endorsed by the officers of the examining board with
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<u>underscored mterial = new</u> [<del>bracketed mterial</del>] = delete B. The board may grant a license without examination and by endorsement to any applicant who has been a licensed physician in Canada and who otherwise meets the requirements set forth in the Medical Practice Act, provided that the applicant is properly endorsed by the officers of either the Canadian medical council or an examining board with jurisdiction within the United States.

C. The board may grant a license without examination and by endorsement to any applicant who has graduated from a medical college located outside the United States or Canada and who is of good moral character, who is in compliance with the United States immigration laws and who has been a licensed physician in the United States or Canada and has practiced medicine in the United States or Canada immediately preceding the application and who otherwise meets the requirements set forth in the Medical Practice Act, provided that the applicant is properly endorsed by the officers of the examining board within the United States or Canada that has jurisdiction.

D. An endorsement provided pursuant to this section shall certify that the applicant has passed an examination that meets with board approval and that the applicant is in good standing in that jurisdiction. <u>In cases</u> <u>when the applicant is board certified, has not been the</u> <u>subject of disciplinary action that would be reportable to the</u> . 135360.1
