AN ACT
RELATI NG TO I NSTRUCTI ONAL MATERI AL; ELI M NATI NG THE MULTI PLE LI ST; GI VI NG MDRE AUTHORI TY TO LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS AND OTHER EDUCATI ONAL ENTI TI ES; ENSURI NG THAT STATE FUNDS ARE NOT USED TO PURCHASE MATERI ALS OF A SECTARI AN, PARTI SAN OR DENOM NATI ONAL CHARACTER OR A RELI GI OUS NATURE; LOWERI NG THE PERCENTAGE DI STRI BUTI ON OF ESTI MATED ENTI TLEMENT; AMENDI NG AND REPEALI NG SECTI ONS OF THE NMEA 1978.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEG SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 22-15-2 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1967, Chapter 16, Secti on 206, as amended) is amended to read:
"22-15-2. DEFI NI TI ONS. -- As used in the Instructional Material Law.
A. "di vision" or "bureau" means the instructional material bureau in the department of education;
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B. "di rect or" or "chi ef" means the chi ef of the bur eau;
C. "instructional material" means school text books and ot her educational medi a that are used as the basis for instruction, i ncl uding conbi nations of textbooks, I earning kits, suppl ement ary materials and el ectronic medi a;
[ D. "mutiple list" means a witten list of those instructional materials approved by the state board;
E.] D. "membershi p" means the [total] average enrol Iment of qual ified students on the fortieth, [day] ei ghtieth and one hundred twentieth days of the prior school year entitled to the free use of instructional material pursuant to the Instructional Material Law, and
[F.] E. "additional pupil" means a pupil in a school district's, state institution's, [ of] private school's or adult basic education center's current year's certified [forty-day] menbership above the number certified in the school district's, state institution's, [日f] private school's or adult basic education center's prior year's [forty-day] mentoer shi p. "

Section 2. Section 22-15-4 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1967, Chapter 16, Section 208, as amended) is amended to read:
"22-15-4. BUREAU- - DUTI ES. -- Subj ect to the pol icies and [regulations] rules of the state board, the bureau shall:
A. administer the provisi ons of the I nstructional

Material Law,
B. enforce [regulations] rules for the handling, safekeeping and distribution of instructional material and instructional material funds and for inventory and accounting procedures to be followed by school districts, state institutions, private schools and adult basic education centers pursuant to the Instructional Material Law,
C. withdraw or withhol d the privilege of participating in the free use of instructional material in case of any viol ation of or noncompliance with the provisions of the Instructional Material Law or any [regulations] rules adopted pursuant thereto; [ and
D. enforce regulations relating to the use and operation of instructional material depositories in the instructional naterial distribution process]
D. enforce rules that require local school boards to implement a process that ensures that parents and ot her comminity menbers are invol ved in the instructional material revi ew process;
E. ensure that instructional material purchased by private schools are not of a sectarian, partisan or denom national character or a religious nature by requiring private school s to submit a list with titles and a brief summary of content of all instructional material purchased with state instructional material funds; and . 135743. 1
F. require an annual report fromeach local school board, state institution, private school or adult basic education center that acquires instructional material pursuant to the I nstructional Material Law. "

Section 3. Section 22-15-5 NMEA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1967, Chapt er 16, Section 209, as amended) is amended to read:
"22-15-5. I NSTRUCTI ONAL MATERI AL FUND. --
A. The state treasurer shall establish a fund to be known as the "i nstructional material fund".
B. The instructional material fund shall be used for the purpose of paying for the cost of purchasing instructional material pursuant to the Instructional Material Law. Transportation charges for the del ivery of instructional material to a school district, a state institution, a private school as agent or an adult basic education center and emergency expenses incurred in provi ding instructional material to st udents may be included as a cost of purchasing instructional material. Charges for rebi nding of used instructional [ materials that appear on the multiple list pursuant to Section 22-15-8 NNSA 1978] material may al so be included as a cost of purchasing instructional material."

Section 4. Section 22-15-8 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1967, Chapt er 16, Secti on 212, as amended) is amended to read:
" 22-15-8. [ MHLTIPLE LIST] SELECTI ON OF I NSTRUCTI ONAL MATERI AL. --
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[ A. The state board shall adopt a mutiple list to be made available to students pursuant to the Instructional Material Law. The state board shall ensure that parents and ot her commaity menbers are involved in the adoption process at the state level.
B.] Pursuant to the provisions of the Instructional Material Law, each local school [di-strict] board, state institution, private school as agent or adult basic education center may sel ect instructional material for the use of its st udents [from the mltiple list adopted by the state board]; provided that none of the instructional material purchased is of a sectarian, partisan or denominational character or a religious nature. Local school boards shall give written notice to parents and other commity members and shall invite parental invol vement in the [adoption] selection process at the school district level. Local school boards shall al so gi ve public notice, whi ch notice may incl ude publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the school district."

Section 5. Section 22-15-9 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1967, Chapter 16, Section 213, as amended) is amended to read:
"22-15-9. DI STRI BUTI ON OF FUNDS FOR I NSTRUCTI ONAL MATERI AL. - -
A. On or before July 1 of each year, the department of education shall allocate to each school di strict, state institution or private school not less than . 135743. 1
[ hinety] seventy-five percent of its estimated entitlement as determined fromthe estimated [forty-day] membership for the next school year. A school district's, state institution's or private school's entitlement is that portion of the total amount of the annual appropriation less a deduction for a reasonable reserve for emergency expenses that its [forty-day] membership bears to the [forty-day] membership of the entire state. For the purpose of this allocation, additional pupils shall be counted as six pupils. The allocation for adult basic education shall be based on a full-time equi val ency obt ai ned by multiplying the total previous year's enrollment by .25 .
B. On or before J anuary 15 of each year, the department of education shall recompute each entitlement [using the forty day menbership-for that year, except for adult basic education] and shall allocate the bal ance of the annual appropriation adjusting for any over- or underestimation made in the first allocation.
[C. An anount not to exceed thirty percent of the allocations attributed to each local school di-strict, state institution or adult basic education center may be used for instructional material not included on the mutiple list provided for in Section 22-15-8 NMSA 1978. Adult basic education centers nay expend up to one hundred percent of their instructional noterial funds for itens that are not on . 135743. 1
the multiplelist.
D.-] C. The department of education shall establish procedures for the distribution of funds directly to [ Hoeat] school districts, state institutions and adult basic education centers. The department of education shall di stribute funds to private school s on a rei mbursement basis for instructional material [included on the mutiple list provided for in Section 22-15-8 NMSA 1978]; provi ded that none of the instructional material purchased is of a sectarian, partisan or denom national character or a rel i gi ous nature.
[E.] D. A school di strict, state institution or adult basic education center that has funds remaining for the purchase of instructional material at the end of the fiscal year shall retain those funds for expenditure in subsequent years. Any bal ance remaining in an instructional material account of a private school at the end of the fiscal year shall remai $n$ available for rei mbursement by the department of education for instructional material purchases in subsequent years."

Section 6. Section 22-15-12 NMEA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1967, Chapt er 16, Section 216, as amended) is amended to read:
"22-15-12. ANNUAL REPORT. --Annually, at a time specified by the department of education, each local school board [ of a school district] and each governing authority of a state institution, private school or adult basic education center . 135743. 1
acqui ring instructional material pursuant to the Instructional Material Law shall file a report with the department of education that includes an accurate record of all instructional material purchased, including cost records, on forms and by procedures prescribed by the department."

Section 7. Section 22-15-13 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1967, Chapter 16, Secti on 217, as amended by Laws 1993, Chapter 156, Secti on 6 and al so by Laws 1993, Chapter 226, Section 44) is amended to read:
" 22-15-13. CONTRACTS W TH PUBLI SHERS. --
A. [The state] A local school board, state institution, private school as agent or adult basic education center may enter into a contract with a publisher or a publ isher's authorized agent for the purchase and del ivery of instructional material [selected fromthe mutiple list adopted by the state board].
B. Payment for instructional material purchased by [the state] a local school board, state institution, private school as agent or adult basic education center shall be made onl $y$ upon performance of the contract and the del ivery and recei pt of the instructional material.
C. Each publisher or publ isher's authorized agent contracting with [the state] a local school board, state institution, private school as agent or adult basic education center for the sale of instructional material shall agree: . 135743. 1
[(1) to file a copy of each itemof instructional material to be furnished under the contract with the state board with a certificate attached identifying it as an exact copy of the item of instructional material to be furnished under the contract;
$(2)]$ (1) that the instructional material furni shed pursuant to the contract shall be of the same qual ity in regard to paper, bi nding, printing, illustrations, subject matter and authorship as the [eopy filed with the state board] copi es sol d to other states; and
[(3)] (2) that if instructional material under the contract is sold el sewhere inthe United States for a price less than that agreed upon in the contract with the [state] local school board, state institution, private school as agent or adult basic education center, the price [to the state] shall be reduced to the same amount.
D. Each contract executed for the acqui sition of instructional material shall include the right of the local school board, state institution, private school as agent or adult basic education center to transcribe and reproduce instructional material in media appropriate for the use of students with visual i mpairment who are unable to use instructional material in conventional print and form Publ ishers of adopted text books shall be required to provide those materials to the local school board, state institution, . 135743. 1
private school as agent or adult basic education center in an el ectronic format specified by the educational entity that is readi ly transl at able into braille and can be used for large print or speech access within a time period specified by the educational entity."

Section 8. REPEAL. --Section 22-15-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967, Chapter 16, Section 215, as amended) is repeal ed.

Section 9. EFFECTI VE DATE. - - The ef fective date of the provi sions of this act is July 1, 2001.
