12	PROCESS FOR LICENSED HEALTH-RELATED PROFESSIONS; ESTABLISHING
13	LICENSING BOARD AND NEW MEXICO HEALTH POLICY COMMISSION
14	RESPONSIBILITIES; ENACTING SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
18	"Health Professions Review Act".
19	Section 2. PURPOSEThe purpose of the Health
20	Professions Review Act is to provide a procedure for objective
21	review of proposed changes in the scope of practice of health
22	professionals licensed by the state in order to ensure that
23	such changes contribute to the improvement of the overall
24	health of the people of New Mexico and to make recommendations
25	of such review available to the legislature.
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1	Section 3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Health
2	Professions Review Act:
3	A. "board" means a licensing board of a specific
4	health profession regulated pursuant to Chapter 61 NMSA 1978;
5	B. "commission" means the New Mexico health policy
6	commission;
7	C. "health profession" or "health professions"
8	means any of those health-related activities and occupations
9	licensed pursuant to Chapter 61, Articles 2, 3, 4, 5A, 6, 7A,
10	8, 9, 9A, 10, 10A, 11, 12A, 12B, 12C, 13, 14A, 14B, 14C, 14D,
11	14E and 31 NMSA 1978; and
12	D. "scope of practice" means those activities
13	permitted each of the health professions as defined in their
14	respective licensing acts and rules adopted pursuant to those
15	acts.
16	Section 4. STATUTORY CHANGEBOARD RESPONSIBILITY
17	A. A person seeking a change in the scope of
18	practice of a health profession shall notify the respective
19	licensing board and request a hearing on the proposal. The
20	licensing board shall notify the commission and the board
21	shall:
22	(1) collect data, including information from
23	the applicant and all other appropriate persons necessary to
24	review the proposal;
25	(2) conduct a technical assessment of the
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proposal, if necessary with the assistance of a technical
 advisory group established for that specific purpose, to
 determine whether the proposal is in the profession's current
 scope of practice; and

5 (3) provide its analysis, conclusions and any
6 recommendations, together with all materials gathered for the
7 review, to the commission.

8 B. The person seeking the change in the scope of
9 practice shall provide the board with all information
10 requested.

Section 5. COMMISSION--SCOPE OF PRACTICE REVIEWS AND CRITERIA--POWERS AND DUTIES.--The commission shall:

A. notify annually all licensing boards of health professions, and, wherever possible, all professional associations and groups of health professions, of both the board's and the commission's responsibilities to review proposed changes in the scope of practice of health professions;

B. ensure that scope of practice reviews by ad hoc review panels are conducted as public hearings and are publicized and conducted pursuant to the requirements of Section 12-8-4 NMSA 1978;

C. provide staff services to all ad hoc review panels created pursuant to Section 6 of the Health Professions Review Act; and

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D. provide the legislature with all assistance
 requested on the proposal.

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Section 6. REVIEW PANELS-- APPOINTMENT-- DUTIES. --

A. The commission shall, upon notification of a proposed change in a health profession scope of practice, appoint an ad hoc review panel of sufficient numbers and expertise to review and make recommendations on the proposed change. Each panel:

9 (1) shall include one board member of the
10 health profession from which the proposed change in scope of
11 practice originates;

(2) may include one additional member from the profession from which the proposed change originates and this member shall be from the professional association of that profession;

(3) shall have no more than one board memberfrom any one board in addition to the board member designatedin Paragraph (1) of this subsection; and

(4) shall have a number equal to one-half the panel's membership of individuals who are consumers and who have no economic interest in the profession originating the request for a change in scope of practice.

B. Each panel shall be chaired by the director of the commission, who shall be a nonvoting member. The panel shall:

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familiarize itself with the commission's 1 (1) rules on procedures and criteria for such reviews; 2 3 (2)ensure appropriate public notice of its proceedings; 4 (3) invite testimony from persons with 5 special knowledge in the field of the proposed change; 6 7 (4) assess the proposal using the following criteria: 8 9 (a) whether proposed changes offer potential harm to the health, safety or welfare of consumers; 10 11 **(b)** if the proposed changes will 12 benefit the health, safety and welfare of health consumers; 13 (c) what economic impact on overall 14 health care delivery the proposed change is likely to have; (d) whether potential benefits of 15 16 proposed changes outweigh potential harm; and 17 (e) the extent to which the proposed 18 changes will affect the availability, accessibility, delivery 19 and quality of health care in New Mexico; 20 conduct the analysis so as to: (5) 21 (a) consider harm to the public in physical, emotional, economic and social contexts; 22 23 ensure that consideration of (b) 24 economic and social benefit does not outweigh the potential of 25 significant physical harm to the consumer; and . 136486. 1 - 5 -

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1	(c) ensure that evidence of potential
2	harm is clearly and directly attributable to the proposal; and
3	(6) provide to the New Mexico legislative
4	council, the legislative finance committee and the legislative
5	health and human services committee a full report, including
6	legislative recommendations, on each proposed change in scope
7	of practice brought before the commission.
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
