19	AND EDUCATION BUREAU]The [chief] director of the New Mexico
20	law enforcement academy shall determine that all applicants
21	for admission to the radio dispatcher training program [of the
22	training and education bureau of the criminal justice
23	department]:
24	A. are citizens <u>or legal permanent residents</u> of
25	the United States and have reached the age of majority;

2	C. have not been convicted of a felony or other

6	and to the [FBI] <u>federal bureau of investigation</u>
7	identification division and by such other investigations as
8	required by the applicant's place of employment; and
9	D. are free of any physical, emotional or mental
10	condition [which] <u>that</u> might adversely affect their
11	performance."
