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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 10-7C-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1990,
17	Chapter 6, Section 5) is amended to read:
18	"10-7C-5. AUTHORITY CREATED
19	A. There is created the "retiree health care
-	authority", which is established to provide for comprehensive
20	group health insurance programs under the Retiree Health Care
21	Act. The authority shall be administratively attached to the
22	public school insurance authority until December 31, 1993.
23	The [executive] director of the public school insurance
24	authority shall be the executive director of the retiree
25	health care authority until December 31, 1993. The board
	created by Section [6 of the Retiree Health Care Act] <u>10-7C-6</u>
	<u>NMSA 1978</u> shall remain fully independent of the board of the
	public school insurance authority.

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1	B. The authority shall also administer the senior
2	prescription drug program in conjunction with or through the
3	consolidated purchasing process pursuant to the Health Care
4	Purchasing Act."
5	Section 2. A new section of the Retiree Health Care Act
6	is enacted to read:
7	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] CREATION OF SENIOR PRESCRIPTION DRUG
8	PROGRAM
9	A. The "senior prescription drug program" is
10	created in the authority.
11	B. To be eligible for the senior prescription drug
12	program, a person shall:
13	(1) be a resident of the state;
14	(2) be sixty-five years of age or older; and
15	(3) not have any other prescription drug
16	benefit.
	C. Upon a determination that the person qualifies
17	for the senior prescription drug program, the authority shall
18	collect an enrollment fee not to exceed sixty dollars (\$60.00)
19	per year. The authority shall collect the enrollment fees,
20	and the enrollment fees shall be used by the authority to
21	cover the cost of administering the program.
22	D. The amount a qualified person pays for a
23	prescription drug shall not exceed the total cost of the
24	dispensing fee plus the contracted discounted price made
25	available to the authority.
	E. The authority shall provide general information
	to the public about the availability of the senior
	prescription drug program.

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F. The "senior prescription drug program fund" is 1 created in the state treasury. All fees collected pursuant to 2 Subsection C of this section shall be deposited in the fund 3 and shall be used by the authority to administer the senior 4 prescription drug program. Money appropriated to the fund or 5 accruing to it through gifts, grants, fees or bequests shall 6 be deposited in the fund. Earnings from investment of the 7 fund shall be credited to the general fund. Money in the fund 8 shall not revert at the end of any fiscal year. Disbursements 9 from the fund shall be made upon warrants drawn by the 10 secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers 11 signed by the director of the authority or his authorized 12 representative. The authority shall annually adjust the 13 enrollment fee to permit necessary administration of the 14 program but shall not exceed the amount established in 15 Subsection C of this section." 16 - 3 -17 18 19 20 21 22 23

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
