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15	WHEREAS, New Mexico law does not require all
16	environmental cleanups of polluted property to result in
17	return of the property to unrestricted use; and
18	WHEREAS, the responsible parties and the department of
19	environment frequently agree that it may be appropriate for
20	certain properties to be returned to some other use, such as
21	industrial or recreational; and
22	WHEREAS, a determination by the department of environment
23	that the property be returned to some other use is often based
24	on the continuing risk to humans and the environment; and
25	WHEREAS, land use restrictions that require the owner to
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<u>underscored mterial = new</u> [<del>bracketed mterial</del>] = delete control access or use in perpetuity are unenforceable under
state law; and

WHEREAS, if the department of environment has the legal authority to allow a property to be returned to a more restrictive land use, considerable money can be saved by both the owners of the property and the department of environment; and

WHEREAS, the authority to enforce environmental covenants will allow the department of environment to permit risk-based cleanup levels in appropriate cases; and

WHEREAS, many states are jointly developing a model covenant bill that gives environmental agencies authority to enforce land use restrictions related the environmental cleanup levels; and

WHEREAS, the department of environment is currently cooperating with other states to formulate a model covenant bill;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of environment be requested to study the issue of regulatory authority to enforce land use restrictions and report its findings and make recommendations for legislation to the appropriate committee by November 2002; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of environment.

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
