WHEREAS, it is estimated that there will be more than three hundred fifteen	g e
million obsolete computers in the United States by 2004; and	1
WHEREAS, as consumers accelerate the pace with which they replace	
computers, landfill managers face a growing dilemma caused by both the volume of	
waste generated by computers and by the hazardous materials in computers that could	
be released into the environment once they are discarded; and	
WHEREAS, New Mexico currently has no regulations concerning the disposal of	
computers; and	
WHEREAS, New Mexico in 1990 enacted the Solid Waste Act in an admirable	

effort to manage the disposal of refuse and to encourage recycling; and

WHEREAS, while there are no large scale computer recycling operations in New Mexico, it is possible that some would be formed if a market were created; and

WHEREAS, it is always desirable to recycle refuse and especially so in the case of computers because of the costs and risks associated with disposing of computers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of environment be requested to study the costs and benefits of implementing a computer recycling program, whether under its own management or that of private enterprise; and

findings and recommendations, if any, to the appropriate interim committee of the legislature prior to December 1, 2003; and	H J M
