"27-2B-6. DURATIONAL LIMITS.--

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A. Pursuant to the federal act, on or after

- July 1, 1997 a participant may receive federally funded cash assistance and services for up to sixty months.
- B. During a participant's fourth, sixth and eighth semi-annual reviews,
 the department shall examine the participant's progress to determine if the participant
 has successfully completed an educational or training program or increased the
 number of hours he is working as required by the federal act. The department may
 refer the participant to alternative work activities or provide additional services to
 address possible barriers to employment facing the participant.
 C. Up to twenty percent of the population of participants may be

exempted from the sixty-month durational limit set out in Subsection A of this section
 because of hardship or because those participants are battered or subject to extreme
 cruelty.

D. For the purposes of this section, a participant has been battered or subjected to extreme cruelty if he can demonstrate by reliable medical, psychological or mental reports, court orders or police reports that he has been subjected to and currently is affected by:
