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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
8	Section 1. HIGHER EDUCATION PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT ENHANCEMENT
9	FUNDPURPOSE
10	A. The "higher education program development enhancement fund" is
11	created in the state treasury. All income earned on investment of the fund shall be
12	credited to the fund and money in the fund shall not revert to any other fund at the
	end of a fiscal year. The fund shall be administered by the commission on higher
13	education and money in the fund is appropriated to the commission to carry out the
14	purposes of this section. Disbursements from the fund shall be by warrant drawn by
15	the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the
16	executive director of the commission on higher education or his authorized
17	representative.
18	B. The higher education program development enhancement fund
19	shall be used to enhance the contribution of post-secondary educational institutions to
	the resolution of critical state issues and the advancement of the welfare of state
20	citizens.
21	C. At the beginning of each fiscal year in which the commission
22	determines that the balance of the fund is sufficient to make awards, the commission
23	shall define or reaffirm no more than four critical issues to be addressed through
24	awards from the fund. Issues to be addressed may include:
25	(1) expanding instructional programs to meet critical statewide
	work force and professional training needs:

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1	(2) enhancing instructional programs that provide employment	S B
2	opportunity for New Mexico students in a global economy; and	
3	(3) developing mission-specific instructional programs that	3 7
4	build on existing institutional academic strengths.	0 P
	D. The commission shall establish criteria and procedures for making	а
5	awards from the fund based on evaluation of competitive proposals submitted by post-	g e
6	secondary educational institutions. Each winning proposal shall address at least one	2
7	of the critical issues defined for use of the fund that year. Criteria may include:	_
8	(1) collaboration among educational agencies and other public	
9	or private entities that demonstrate a competency regarding the issues addressed by	
10	the proposal;	
11	(2) the commitment of matching money; and	
	(3) evaluation components.	
12	E. The commission shall report annually to the legislature and the	
13	governor on the status of the fund and projects supported by the fund.	
14	Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the provisions of this act	
15	is July 1, 2003.	
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
