6	Section 1. A new section of the Medical Insurance Pool Act is enacted to read: "PRESCRIPTION DRUG PROGRAMCOST-SHARING
7	A. The board may establish a prescription drug program, in whole or in
	part, including a pilot or phase-in program, to offer selected eligible persons the ability
8	to purchase prescription drugs. The board may establish varying levels of eligibility
	and cost-sharing criteria as needed for selected eligible persons and, if established,
10	shall ensure that cost-containment mechanisms are included in the program.
11	B. The board may establish the cost-sharing amounts payable by a
12	person enrolled in the prescription drug program, including the premium, deductible,
13	coinsurance, co-payment and other out-of-pocket expenses.
14	C. If the board establishes a prescription drug program, the board
15	shall establish the assessments pursuant to Section 59A-54-10 NMSA 1978.
16	D. If the board establishes a prescription drug program, the
17	assessment for a pool member shall be determined in the same manner as provided in
	this section provided that a pool member shall be allowed a fifty percent credit for the
18	prescription drug program assessment on the premium tax return for that member.
19	E. The board may issue a pool prescription drug program benefit
20	policy for a person who is over the age of sixty-five and unable to purchase or is
21	ineligible for a similar prescription drug program. The board may issue a pool
22	prescription drug program benefit policy for a person who is eligible for a state-funded
23	or state-operated low-income pharmacy benefit program.
24	F. If the board establishes a prescription drug program, the board shall
	cooperate with other state and federal prescription drug initiatives."
