S A JOINT MEMORIAL 1 J REQUESTING A STUDY OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ALIGNING EARLY CHILD 2 Μ CARE EDUCATION PROGRAMS IN NEW MEXICO. 3 2 Ρ 4 а WHEREAS, research has shown that high-quality pre-kindergarten early g 5 е education programs produce long-term benefits for children who enroll in them, 6 1 including improved overall academic performance, increased motivation, increased 7 self-confidence, better attendance in school and improved classroom behavior; and WHEREAS, economic analysis of research has shown that every dollar spent 8 on providing high-quality early care and education programs results in a seven-dollar 9 (\$7.00) savings to taxpayers; and 10 WHEREAS, thirty-six states currently have legislation mandating the 11 coordination of child care systems with other early education systems and twenty-one 12 states have laws that require early childhood education programs to coordinate with 13 child care programs in order to be eligible for funding under a statewide early 14 childhood initiative; and WHEREAS, in New Mexico, there is currently no entity responsible for the 15 coordination of early care and education programs or for the collection of data about 16 existing systems of early care and education such as the number of children being 17 served, types of programs available, the amount of federal and state funds being 18 expended for these services and the purpose or expected outcomes of programs; and 19 WHEREAS, it is estimated that approximately two hundred fifty million dollars 20 (\$250,000,000) of federal and state funds are being expended annually for early care 21 and education programs in New Mexico; and WHEREAS, the interagency coordinating group was created in law within the 22 children, youth and families department in 1992 and is comprised of the secretary of 23 finance and administration, the secretary of health, the secretary of human services, 24 the secretary of labor, the superintendent of public instruction, the chairman of the 25
