	WHEREAS, New Mexico's water is a precious commodity requiring millions of
7	dollars in expenditures for its management, regulation and conservation; and
8	WHEREAS, state law makes waste of water a crime, and such depletions of
9	water resources could make the state vulnerable in federal lawsuits; and
10	WHEREAS, much of the state's water infrastructure is old and in need of
11	repair, replacement and expansion; and
	WHEREAS, many municipal water utilities are trying to keep up with repairs of
12	leaks and water loss with inadequate funding; and
13	WHEREAS, leakages in several cities attracted significant media attention
14	during this past summer's drought; and
15	WHEREAS, improvements in the state's water delivery systems will require
16	significant sums of money and cooperation among many different state, local
17	government and, perhaps, federal agencies;
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the water trust board and the office of the state
19	engineer, with the cooperation of municipalities, the municipal league, water and
20	sanitation districts, mutual domestic water consumers associations and other
21	interested parties, be requested to compile information on the extent of leakage and
22	water infrastructure problems; and
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the water trust board and the office of the
24	state engineer make recommendations for remedies to the appropriate committee of
25	the legislature by December 1, 2003; and
