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7	WHEREAS, stroke is the third leading cause of death in the United States	'
8	today, ranking behind only heart disease and cancer, with nearly one hundred	
9	seventy-five thousand Americans dying each year from stroke; and	
10	WHEREAS, stroke is the leading cause of severe long-term disability in the	
11	United States and each year more than seven hundred fifty thousand Americans suffer	
	a new or recurrent stroke; and	
12	WHEREAS, stroke is a leading cause of death and disability in New Mexico,	
13	killing two New Mexicans every day and disabling over three thousand New Mexicans	
14	every year; and	
15	WHEREAS, adults with diabetes and Hispanic populations are at a higher risk	
16	in general for stroke; and	
17	WHEREAS, currently available treatments may reduce the number of deaths	
18	and disabilities caused by strokes; and	
	WHEREAS, there are five links in the stroke chain of survival:	
19	<ul> <li>A. rapid recognition and reaction to stroke warning signs;</li> </ul>	
20	B. rapid start of pre-hospital care;	
21	C. rapid emergency medical services system transport and hospital	
22	pre-notification;	
23	D. rapid diagnosis and treatment at the hospital; and	
24	E. appropriate rehabilitation; and	
25	WHEREAS, the American stroke association believes that by strengthening the	
	chain of survival the outcomes for many stroke patients can be improved; and	

1	WHEREAS, Americans will pay approximately forty-nine billion dollars
2	(\$49,000,000,000) in the coming year for stroke-related medical and disability costs
3	that may be reduced through improved response, diagnosis and treatment for stroke;
4	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the secretary of health be requested to appoint a stroke
5	task force to evaluate potential strategies for stroke awareness, pre-hospital and
6	acute stroke treatment and develop a statewide needs assessment, outlining relevant
7	resources for response, diagnosis and treatment in pre-hospital and acute care
8	settings; and
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be composed of eighteen
10	members as follows:
11	A. one stroke survivor;
	B. one stroke family caregiver;
12	C. six physicians actively involved in stroke care, such as
13	representatives from the following specialties: primary care, emergency medicine,
14	neurology, neurosurgery, neuroradiology and physiatry;
15	D. three allied health professionals actively involved in acute or
16	rehabilitative stroke care, such as representatives of the following: occupational
17	therapy, physical therapy, speech language pathology and registered nursing;
18	<ul><li>E. one pre-hospital emergency medical services person;</li></ul>
19	F. one urban and one rural hospital administrator;
	G. one health insurance administrator or representative; and
20	H. three representatives from interested nonprofit groups, such as the
21	following: the New Mexico medical review association, the American stroke association
22	and the brain injury association of New Mexico; and
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duties of the task force include:
24	A. the completion of a statewide comprehensive stroke awareness and
25	stroke treatment needs assessment, including:
	<ol> <li>stroke awareness at the public, emergency medical</li> </ol>

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1	services and hospital levels for prevention, early response and public and professional
2	education;
3	(2) stroke treatment at the emergency medical services,
4	emergency department or facility and rehabilitation levels;
	(3) access to rapid transport, state-of-the-art diagnostic
5	technologies and treatments and consistent diagnosis and treatment; and
6	(4) optimal utilization of resources for efficiency and
7	effectiveness;
8	B. the development of recommendations for
9	New Mexico based on the evaluation of state-of-the-art stroke treatments in all stages
10	of the stroke care continuum practiced outside New Mexico for:
11	(1) potential implementation strategies for stroke therapies,
	including a stroke center system, based on medical evidence; and
12	(2) creation of a statewide comprehensive, consistent system
13	of stroke care that will provide rapid and appropriate stroke treatment in all stages of
14	the stroke care continuum to optimize outcomes;
15	C. a projection of the health, quality of life and economic benefits of
16	optimal stroke treatment; and
<b>17</b>	D. an exploration of funding opportunities to support implementation of
18	the task force recommendations; and
	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its findings and
19	recommendations to the department of health, the legislative health and human
20	services committee and the governor prior to the first session of the forty-seventh
21	legislature; and
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be
23	transmitted to the governor and the secretary of health.
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
