12	WHEREAS, approximately thirteen thousand people in
13	New Mexico, including veterans, families with children and persons with disabilities, are
14	homeless at any given date and time; and
15	WHEREAS, it has been found that people who are chronically homeless most
16	often suffer serious mental health and substance use disorders, also called co-
17	occurring disorders; and
18	WHEREAS, it has been found that without proper treatment and support, the
	chronically homeless are high users of jail, emergency room and other hospital
19	services, causing an undue financial burden of approximately forty thousand dollars
20	(\$40,000) per person each year to local community service systems, including local
21	governments; and
22	WHEREAS, the federal department of health and human services, in
23	conjunction with the veterans' administration and the department of housing and urban
24	development, has invited representatives from New Mexico's public and private sector
25	to participate in a national policy academy to address the problem of chronic
د.	homelessness, to determine how to better provide access to mainstream services to

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2	WHEREAS, a state action plan to resolve chronic homelessness in New Mexico
3	must include economic development incentives, affordable housing and integrated
4	health and educational supports and services, including therapeutic daycare and
	substance abuse and behavioral health treatment;
5	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
6	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of health be requested to convene a
7	task force in cooperation with local, state and federal agencies and providers of
8	support and services to the homeless, including the human services department, the
9	children, youth and families department, the state department of public education, the
10	labor department, the New Mexico veterans' service commission, the corrections
11	department, the New Mexico health policy commission and the New Mexico mortgage
	finance authority, to address the chronic problem of homelessness and to better
12	provide access to mainstream services to the homeless in New Mexico; and
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force develop a state action plan to
14	address chronic homelessness in
15	New Mexico and present its findings and recommendations to the governor and the
16	appropriate interim legislative committee before the second session of the forty-sixth
17	legislature; and
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the
