2	REQUESTING THE STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT TO
3	DIRECT ITS EFFORTS AND FEDERAL FUNDING TOWARD MAKING PEDESTRIAN
4	AND BICYCLE TRAFFIC SAFER AND CREATING SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS.
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	WHEREAS, New Mexico has the nation's highest pedestrian fatality rate; and
6	WHEREAS, New Mexico has the nation's sixth highest bicyclist fatality rate; and
7	WHEREAS, children who walk and ride bicycles are among the groups that are
8	more at risk from unsafe streets; and
9	WHEREAS, many of New Mexico's communities lack sidewalks, bicycle paths,
10	street crossings or other elements necessary to provide safe routes to schools; and
	WHEREAS, the federal government provides millions of dollars to New Mexico
11	through the federal surface transportation program and the federal hazard elimination
12	program to pay for non-construction costs aimed at reducing injuries and deaths from
13	motor vehicle accidents and to resolve safety problems at hazardous locations and
14	roads that constitute a danger to motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists; and
15	WHEREAS, decreases in fatalities among pedestrians and bicyclists are more
16	often attributable to students walking and riding bicycles less and riding in cars more
17	often; and
	WHEREAS, the surgeon general observed that seventy-eight percent of
18	children are not active enough; one in five children is overweight or at risk of becoming
19	overweight; and one in three teenagers is overweight or at risk of becoming
20	overweight; and
21	WHEREAS, safer routes to school can provide the ability to increase
22	pedestrian and bicycle traffic to help students get more regular exercise;
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
24	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the state highway and transportation department be
	requested to direct more of its efforts and federal funding on improving bicycle and
25	pedestrian access and on traffic-calming projects in school zones rather than simply

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1	building and widening intersections; and
2	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state highway and transportation
3	department work with its bicycle, pedestrian and equestrian committee, with school
4	districts and law enforcement agencies and with parents, teachers and school
	administrators to develop innovative programs and initiatives to create safe routes to
5	school; and
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state highway and transportation
7	department present its findings and recommendations to the appropriate interim
8	legislative committee by October 30, 2003; and
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the
10	state highway and transportation department.
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
