1	A JOINT MEMORIAL
2	REQUESTING THE COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION AND THE STATE
3	DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION TO IMPROVE THE STATE'S CONCURRENT
4	ENROLLMENT PROGRAM.
5	WHEREAS, concurrent enrollment refers to enrollment of secondary-level
6	students in academic and vocational courses at post-secondary institutions, which
7	allows students to receive credit at the high school and post-secondary levels; and
8	WHEREAS, conditions for concurrent enrollment are defined as having a
9	written agreement between the cooperating public school district and the post-
10	secondary institution; and
	WHEREAS, Laws 1990, Chapter 25, amended language specifying that the
11	public school district shall transfer to the post-secondary institution attended by the
12	high school student the tuition and fees if the student is counted in the membership of
13	the public school district and receives high school credit for coursework taken at the
14	post-secondary institution; and
15	WHEREAS, for several years, concerns have been expressed to the state
16	board of education and the commission on higher education about the state's
17	concurrent enrollment program; and
18	WHEREAS, in 2002, the commission on higher education and the state
	department of public education developed electronic surveys that gathered
19	information on the concurrent enrollment program; and
20	WHEREAS, the survey data supports the opinion that at the higher education
21	and school district levels, as well as in local partnerships, there is confusion and
22	inconsistency in program implementation; and
23	WHEREAS, many of the concurrent enrollment agreements, as reported in the
24	survey and analyzed by staff, are not in compliance with requirements for funding,
25	indicating inconsistencies in eligibility requirements, payment, curriculum levels and
	faculty arrangements; and

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2	taught under concurrent enrollment agreements, a review of the curriculum has yet to
3	be conducted to determine if classes include the appropriate level of instruction being
4	taught on campus; and
	WHEREAS, requests have been made by post-secondary institutions, school
5	districts and students' parents to have the state review, clarify and coordinate efforts;
6	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
7	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the commission on higher education and the state
8	department of public education be requested to work in collaboration with appropriate
9	organizations to improve the state's concurrent enrollment program; and
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the commission on higher education and the
11	state department of public education be requested to develop a statewide advisory
	committee to:
12	A. obtain input from students, parents, school administrators and post-
13	secondary concurrent enrollment administrators;
14	B. review and make policy recommendations to the commission on
15	higher education and the state department of public education;
16	C. review the concurrent enrollment program from
17	a systemic approach and create a more "customer-friendly" approach to support
18	students who can benefit from an accelerated learning experience;
	D. develop a policy that establishes acceptable course content areas,
19	including consideration of tuition transfer, for the concurrent enrollment program;
20	E. establish methods for both agencies to collect and share
21	information;
22	F. create a means for program accountability, possibly through
23	enrollment verification visits to the post-secondary institutions and accreditation visits
24	to the schools;
	G. develop a plan to disseminate program information to stakeholders
25	and provide incentives to participate in the program; and

WHEREAS, despite questions about the kinds of coursework that can be

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1	H. review statutory changes that may be needed to ensure program
2	and funding consistency based on the recommendations developed; and
3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the findings, conclusions and
4	recommendations of the statewide advisory committee be presented to the legislative
5	education study committee by November 30, 2003; and

6	commission on higher education, the state department of public education and the
7	legislative education study committee.
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
